


As part of our Lost Letters project with Surrey History Centre, It's Not Your Birthday But... are inviting you to send wishes to newlyweds far and wide.

Well wishes for newlyweds were found in the archives in the form of letters and telegrams. The letter below was written to Lily Ede who married Jimmie Ede in 1917. It's a reflection of the times that the sender of this telegram, Lily's friend Evelyn, highlights Lily being a good catch on account of her home-making skills:









"I know one thing. That Mr Ede is lucky in securing one so well fitted for the making of a real home. God bless you dear and give you all the happiness it is possible to have. We know you will have a strong arm to lean upon. Will and I both wish you all joy and happiness, fond love."


