

# Learn the 10 Most useful Adverbial Expressions

## 1. A tiempo

On time

When you want to express how reliable someone was.

Ella llegó a tiempo para su clase.

She arrives on time to her class.

## 2. Acabar de

To have just done something.

Use this verb when you say that you have just finished something

Acabo de practicar mis frases adverbiales.

## 3. Cada vez más

*More and more*

Cada vez que participes en clase aprenderás más.

Each time you participate in class you will learn more.

## 4. Con frecuencia

*Frequently*

Asistimos a reuniones con frecuencia.

*We attend meetings frequently.*

¿Con qué frecuencia practicas tu español?

## 5. **Contar con** - to rely o to count on

This is a good phrase to use when you want to let someone know how important they are to you.

Cuenta conmigo para ayudarte a practicar tus frases verbales.

Count on me to help you practice the phrases.

## 6. **Estar para** -

To be about to...(in SPAIN) Estoy para terminar mi lección de las frases verbales ( I am about to finish my lesson).

To be in the mood for.. (Latinoamérica) Estoy como para tomar una siesta. I am in the mood to take a nap.

7. **Estar por** : to be in favor of (Spain ). In Spain this is a great way to express what you would like to do. It's also used to express your Preference: Estoy por la Democracia. I am in favor of democracy.

To be about to... ( Latinoamerica ) In latinoamérica is used when you are in the urge to do something at the moment... Estoy por comer un chocolate. I feel like eating chocolate.

8. **Pensar en** : To think of /or planning to ... Pienso en mi familia.. I am thinking of my family.

Pienso en viajar pronto.. I plan to travel soon

### 9. **SOLER**

- Soler + infinitive| Is used to communicate habitual actions.

Suelo levantarme temprano todos los días ( *I usually get up early every day* ).

Y tú a qué horas sueles levantarte?

And what time do you usually get up every day?

### 10. **Volver a**

- Volver a + infinitive Is used to indicate the repetition of an action.
- Volvió a llover hoy
- *It rained again today* :)
