Leilani Estates

Albizia Trees – These invasive trees can grow 20' a year. Falling branches can damage power lines and buildings. There has been a concerted effort to poison and/or remove potentially hazardous albizias. <https://www.biisc.org/wp-content/uploads/The-Tree-That-Ate-Puna-compressed.pdf>

CERT – The Community Emergency Response Team is a group of trained volunteers committed to providing an immediate emergency response in the event of a disaster. CERT volunteers have been deployed by Hawaii County Civil Defense after recent hurricanes and volcanic eruptions in Leilani Estates to assist as needed. Civil Defense Siren Test – On the first weekday of each calendar month, Civil Defense tests their sirens island-wide at 11:45 am. One of these sirens is located on the Kuponu (East) side of the LCA Park, near the Verizon cell tower.

Coqui Frogs – Coqui frogs are another invasive species that apparently came to us with plants from Puerto Rico. Coqui frogs are with us to stay, but there are some ways to minimize their existence around your property. www.ctahr.hawaii.edu/coqui

Loose/Noisy Dogs – Leilani Estates has a Leash Law Policy and multiple violations will result in fines. Neighborhood Watch – Leilani Estates' Neighborhood Watch has been in existence for over 30 years. Volunteer drivers, walkers, cyclists and window watchers contribute to Leilani Estates being the safest community in the Puna District. All residents are invited to attend the monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting at 7 pm on the last Tuesday of each month @ 13-3441 Moku St.

Rapid Ohia Death – (ROD) evolved over the past decade and has affected many trees here in the Ohia forests. Efforts are in place to control the spread of ROD by not moving/removing dead Ohia trees from your property to other locations on the island. www.rapidohiadeath.org

Water Catchment – Since county water is not available in Leilani Estates, homes here have water catchment systems. Rain water is collected from the roof of your home into rain gutters that drain into a large water tank. The water is then pumped into your home and filtered prior to use.

Pahoa

Farmers Markets – Each Sunday there is a farmers market in downtown Pahoa on Pahoa Village Road and across the side street by the skate park (behind Bank of Hawaii and the Community Center). The large Maku'u farmers market is open each Sunday morning a few miles north of Pahoa on Hwy 130 from 8 am – 1 pm.

Gas Stations - Four gas stations are located in Pahoa. N&P Market at the South end of Pahoa Village Road is the closest gas station to Leilani Estates. The Woodlands gas station is by Burger King on Kahakai Street between Hwy 130 and Pahoa Village Road. There are also Aloha gas stations at each of the two shopping centers, Pahoa Marketplace near the Hwy 130 round-about and Puna Kai Shopping Center across from Long's Drug.

Grocery Stores – A 7-11 and an Island Naturals health food store are located in downtown Pahoa on Pahoa Village Road. A large grocery store, Malama Market, is located in the Puna Kai Shopping Center at the North end of Pahoa. The Woodlands and N&P gas stations and Longs Drug also have grocery items.

Hardware Store – An Ace Hardware is located in the Pahoa Marketplace Shopping Center near the Hwy 130 round-about in Pahoa.

Library – The Pahoia Public Library, a branch of the Hawaii State Library, is located at the Pahoia High School. It's on the short side street (first left) going into town from the traffic light. The LCA Office also has a small library of paperback books (self-serve).

Police & Fire Station – The Pahoia Fire Station and the Pahoia Police Department are on Hwy 130 just north of town. The **Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)** is also located there for assistance with drivers' licenses and vehicle registration.

Post Office – A U.S. Post Office is located at the intersection of Pahoia Village Road and Post Office Road at the North end of the business district.

Propane – Sustained Propane is located on Hwy 130 at the entrance to Maku'u Farmers Market. It is open daily 8am – 6pm (opens at 1:15pm on Sundays). Ace Hardware in the Pahoia Marketplace shopping center by the Hwy 130 roundabout sells propane. Also K&K Propane located next door to the N&P Market/Gas station at the South end of Pahoia Village Road, open Mon-Sat 7:30 am – 4:00 pm. Waikoloa Propane (self-serve) is located in the Puna Kai Shopping Center, open Mon-Sat 9:00 am-5:00 pm.

Recycling – The Redemption Center for Hawaii aluminum can, glass and plastic bottle deposits is located across the street from the Pahoia Post Office on Pahoia Village Road. Aluminum cans, glass bottles and plastic bottles must be sorted separately (no caps). Open daily. (Also see Transfer Station)

Senior Center – The Pahoia Senior Center provides information and services for the elderly. It's located in Pahoia at 15-3016 Kauhale Street behind the Bank of Hawaii. Phone (808) 965-2705 and email: csepahoa@hawaiicounty.gov.

Swimming Pool – The Pahoia District Park entrance is also on Kauhale Street behind the Bank of Hawaii. The Olympic-sized pool with lap lanes and a separate Kids' Pool are open every day. <https://www.parks.hawaiicounty.gov/facilities-parks/aquatics>

Transfer Station – The Pahoia Transfer Station is on Cemetery Road West of downtown Pahoia. Take Pahoia Village Road to Apa'a Street, which becomes Cemetery Road. Hours are 6am – 6pm daily for disposal of household trash. Recycling is limited to cardboard, glass and clean metals (sorted separately) and green waste.

Hele-On Bus – Hawaii County's Mass Transit has a bus route between Hilo and Seaview/Kalapana that is scheduled to run several times a day. That bus route includes stops in Pahoa, Kea'au and communities in South Puna (Nanawale, Hawaiian Beaches, Hawaii Paradise Park, etc.). The bus stop for Leilani Estates is on Hwy 130 at the intersection with Leilani Ave.

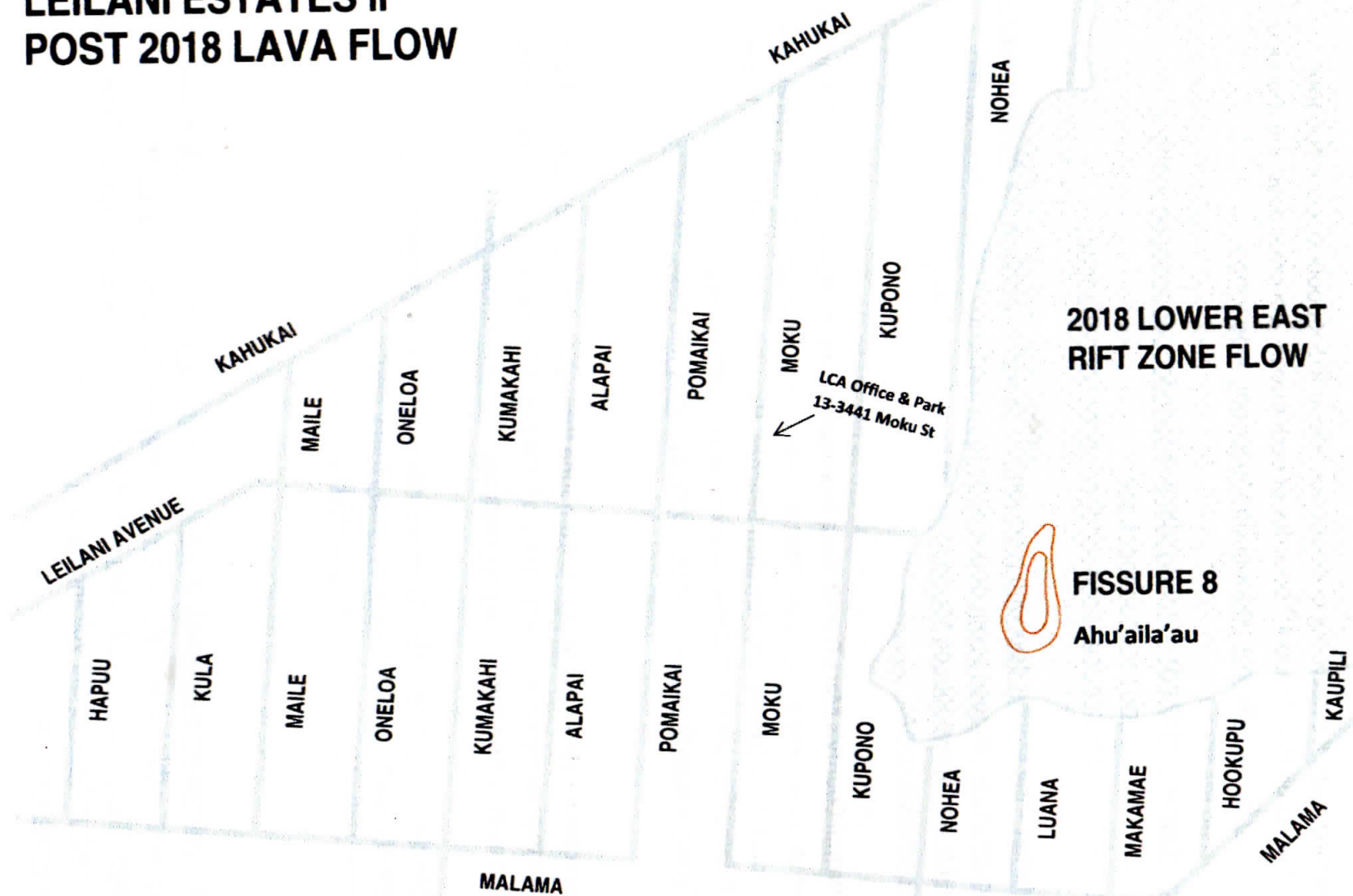
