
## Antigone Concept

## **Mood Board**


- Multiple references to ivy in the script - growing onto the columns (weathered and decaying, not lush and green).
- Using classic Greek imagery and structural elements. (Ionic columns).
- Chipped stairs and columns.
   Antigone takes place after the story of Oedipus, so Thebes already in disarray. Reflecting the disorder through physical structural elements.
- Warm off-white in contrast with cooler-toned tarnished golden door.




## Jacob's Ladder and Biblical References

- The story of Jacob's Ladder in the Bible tells of a dream Jacob has where he sees a staircase leading directly up to Heaven with Angels walking up and down. In more modern media, the staircase is read as a bad omen, one that might mean your end is nearing.
- I wanted to pervert the idea of a one-way ticket to unending peace. In this set design, the curved staircase leads to a tarnished golden door that symbolizes the "Golden Gates to Heaven", with an alter at the foot.

- "Antigone" depicts a ruler's abuse of power and reflects the idea that "no good deed goes unpunished." Even Antigone's live imprisonment in a tomb covered with stone mirrors that in the Bible.
- I wanted there to be room for isolation, so the alter representing all aspects of sacrifice stands alone downstage.
