Calls are Needed!!!

THREE senators introduced bills specifically designed to protect Michigan communities from what's happening right now in Mason!

Senate Bill 761: Limits massive water withdrawals that never return to the aquifer (presented by Senator Rosemary Bayer)

Senate Bill 762: Requires data centers to actually REPORT their water and energy usage (presented by Senator Sue Shink)

Senate Bill 763: Stops utilities from passing infrastructure costs to residential ratepayers (presented by Senator Erika Geiss)

While the Mayor & City Manager make light of concerns-- **Senator Bayer explicitly named MASON as one of the communities where residents are "rightfully concerned" about data center water withdrawals.**

Senator Geiss wrote her bill to prevent EXACTLY what's happening here--**data centers paying the same rate as residents while YOU subsidize system upgrades.**

Senator Shink's reporting requirements addresses **lack of transparency** - exactly what Mason residents are continuing to experience: Edited timelines & website wording; Refusal to share data with neighboring communities; Delays and Refusal of FOIAs.

THE STATE LEGISLATURE IS WATCHING MASON.

1. Request that Bills 761, 762, & 763 get hearings ASAP - so they can get strengthened & go to the floor for a vote!
