SPEED MOUNTING COMPETITION

Winner will receive the NCTA Speed Mount Belt Buckle

Returning this year will be the Speed Mounting Competition sponsored by Head Quarters Taxidermy Supply. The Speed Mounting Competition is a fun friendly competition and lots fun to watch.

There will be an entry fee of \$25 to enter, competitors must supply their own mounting stand, tools & supplies (NCTA only supplies time & space for the competition) and you must be a current NCTA member to sign up (So get those memberships in!!). Skin and form can be prepped and ready, but ALL material must be separate and nothing pre-installed. You will have 3 hours to complete your piece, at which time you will not be allowed to touch until the following day for half an hour for final adjustments. The four judges will determine which three pieces they feel in their opinions are the top three winners. It will be scored using the same rules and criteria as a commercial entry into the competition. All rules and determination of entries and material will be at the NCTA leadership and judge's discretion.

Competition Divisions

Competition Entry Fee: \$25 per entry Collective Artist Division: \$50 per entry

Commercial Division

The mounts will be judged from a distance and the judge will be looking for a good, sound commercial work. There will be multiple first, second, and third place ribbons. Entry fee is the same as the other divisions. You may enter a mount in any category but after you receive two 1st place ribbons in an individual category you have to more on to the Professional Division. You will NOT receive a score sheet.

Youth Division

No entry fee with registered adult. This includes any youth 12 years old or younger.

Amateur Division

This division is for someone just starting to compete. You are competing against a score sheet, not against other competitors.

90-100= 1^{st} Place 80-89= 2^{nd} Place 70-79= 3^{rd} Place

Professional Division

This division is for someone who has experience but still wants to learn. You are competing against a score sheet, not against other competitors.

90-100= 1st Place 80-89= 2nd Place 70-79= 3rd Place

Masters Division

You can enter the Masters Division of your own choosing, but if you have an Award of Excellence in any category or have taken a mount to a higher competition (NTA or World) and have won 1st Place, you have to enter Masters Division. If you have two mounts in the same category you must enter them into the same division (for example: two shoulder mount whitetail deer – you cannot enter one into Professional and one into Masters, you have to enter both into one or the other). State Champions will come from this division in each category if there is a mount score 90 or above. Masters division will be divided into all categories same as Professional and Amateur.

90-100= 1st Place 80-89= 2nd Place 70-79= 3rd Place

Collective Artist Division

This division has been setup for those taxidermists who want to combine their skills on a certain mount. All taxidermists, Amateur through Masters may compete on a certain piece or pieces. Pieces will be judged for artistic composition by the judges. Scores will be combined by the number of animals and then divided by that number to determine final score. Three ribbon elimination, no multiple ribbons. Scores do not count for points toward your Award of Excellence.

Awards...

Breathrough Award- The Judge's Choice Best of Show, chosen from first place entries

Pro 1 Award- Judges' Choice Best Mount using either the PRO-1 Hide Paste and / or Tans in the mount. Master & Professional entries are eligible.

Wasco Award- Most Artistic Entry chosen by judges

Artisan Award- The Artisan Award is chosen by taxidermists - not judges

Van Dyke's Award- Most Original mount in the competition chosen by the judges

Chris Barnhardt Award- A mount that tells the best story, open to all mounts in competition room

McKenzie Distinguished Award- Any member, in good standing, with their state association, who has promoted professionalism in his/her business, Advance the art of taxidermy,

Depict taxidermy and hunting in a positive image, Share knowledge of taxidermy techniques, Improve the quality of his/her taxidermy work, Promote the goals of the state association. Chosen by board and members of the association.

Best All Around Taxidermist- Highest combined score of 4 mounts in different cateogies, Whitetail, Fish/Reptile, Birds, Lifesize/Gamehead

McKenzie Taxidermist's Choice- Best Whitetail, Best Fish, Best Bird, Best Lifesize

People's Choice Best of Show- Master's, Professional, & Amatuer Division

People's Choice- Best Reptile, Best Gamehead

Polytranspar Award- Highest scoring fish using Polytranspar paint

Ascent Award- Chosen by judges

President's Challenge Award- Chosen by the president and is not based on scores. (Whitetail 2025) \$100 to the winner

Mounted in Alaska Award- Best lifesize mount that tells a story, chosen by judges

Matuska Competpetiors Award- Awarded to the Competitor with 4 of the highest scoring enteries in the Masters(Gold Eagle) and Professional Division(Silver Eagle). All entries must have a 1ST or 2ND place ribbon with a combined score of 350 or greater.

Gary Bruch – Fish/Reptiles

I operate a fish only taxidermy studio in south central Pa. I have been transitioning to selling fish replicas and fish heads over the last couple years. In the past 2 decades I have judged or been asked to judge most of the taxidermy associations in the country and the WTC twice. I have won more awards than I care to mention with the most notable being warm water World Champion. When not doing taxidermy, I spend my time with my granddaughters playing Barbie's and having tea parties!

Page Nethercutt - Birds

Hello everyone! At the last NC show I attended, I noticed lots of new faces. That's great! For those that don't know me, my name is Page Nethercutt. I've been around for a while. I started attending the NCTA as a kid with my dad, back in the 80's. I did my 1st mount 46 years ago, at 8 years old. After growing up farming, commercial fishing, and a stint in the military, I went into business for myself. Most of my work involved mammals, but it was birds where I made my mark. As a competitor, I've won many of the top awards in several states. Among them are numerous State Champion Titles, 4 Wasco's, 5 Van Dykes, 3 Big Rock NA Champion awards, The Artisan, 2 Breakthroughs, and Taxidermist of the Year are just some of my highest achievements. I was the youngest to win the Master Taxidermist Award at the NCTA. Besides being a taxidermist, I also wrote for Taxidermy Today for 9 years. I have 3 videos with Taxidermy Training Unlimited, and I sculpt bird bodies and heads for Head Quarters Taxidermy supply. I even went to Hollywood, where I took part in a taxidermy reality show for AMC called Immortalized. It's currently a rerun and you can stream it on Tubi if you'd like. Born and raised in Pamlico County, just outside of New Bern, North Carolina, I live with my beautiful wife Bonnie. We have 5 kids and 5 grandkids. We enjoy gardening, fishing, and hunting. The NCTA helped me and my business become a much better taxidermist. So, when they ask for help, I'm glad to oblige. I'll be doing a flying mount for my seminar. Focusing on the skeleton, reference, and how to get some of those more interesting poses. Hope to see y'all there!

Jason Krause - Game heads, Lifesize

Hello NCTA! I'm honored to be your mammal judge once again; I was here in 2018 and had a wonderful time. I'm from Pine Grove, PA where I have a full-time studio. I enjoy competing also and over the years have won at Worlds, Nationals, Big Rock, Regionals and the four states where I have gone, (PA, MD, OH, WV). I'll do my very best to help you on your journey to achieve your goals as a taxidermist. I'm looking forward to seeing you all and your pieces.

Dalton Jeffers - Whitetail Deer

Hi! My name is Dalton Jeffers, and together with my dad (Tom Jeffers), I own and operate a full-time taxidermy studio and supply company-Rock Ridge Wildlife Artistry.

Since my dad was a taxidermist, I grew up "helping" my dad in the shop. I mounted my first piece at 8 years old - a spare duck of my dad's, and continued to mess with extras and help in the shop as time went on. In high school, I mounted my first deer. Then in 2021, I competed in my first show. I entered two geese that I mounted during COVID and received two blue ribbon

s and a best of category. That was all it took, I was hooked! I loved taking a deep dive into all the details that make a mount look realistic, and discovering all the techniques that turn **a** mount into art.

Since that first show, I have been able to compete in Virginia, North Carolina, West Virginia, Maryland, and at the National, and the World shows in 2024. Over the last four years, I have received 3 Breakthrough Best of Show awards, multiple State Champions, the 2024 National Champion Medallion for Short Haired Open Mouth Whitetail, and the 2024 National Silver Medallion in Long Haired Open Mouth Whitetail. At the 2024 World Show, I received a Third Place in Masters Division for Long Haired Open Mouth Whitetail.

I have had amazing teachers and judges that were very generous with their knowledge and time over the years, which has allowed me to do what I love.

I am honored to be your whitetail judge, and look forward to seeing you in my seminar, where we will do a deep dive on eye rotations.

Bob Hutchinson - Habitat

Bob "Hutch" Hutchinson is from Mt. Pleasant, Pennsylvania. He has been doing taxidermy since 1980 and operating a full-time studio since 2001. Through the years, he has earned multiple awards at the state and world levels and has earned his Master's Certificate in Habitat in 2019. He is passionate about habitat and the influence and contribution it has to the overall mount appearance. He was the first designated habitat judge for the nationals in 2016 and over the years he has also judged at many state shows. He was the first ever habitat judge for the World Show in 2019, and then again in 2022 and 2024. In 2023, he was the very first to judge habitat along with mammals for the European Taxidermy Championships in Salzburg, Austria. He has also taught habitat techniques in Budapest, Hungary. Hutch is looking forward to the 2025 Ohio show and is honored to be your habitat judge.

Donna has been involved in taxidermy for over 20 years and part of the NCTA for nearly that long and hosted many Children's seminars. She has received numerous Awards of Excellence, Best of Category, and the Woody Award. She's the 2nd woman to receive the Master Taxidermy Award.
