Member Ernie Pauley is in the process of marrying a 1949 Dodge Pickup body to a 1983 Dodge frame! The finished vehicle will have a MOPAR 360 cu in engine with an A-833 New Process 4-speed overdrive tranny.


Ernie reports: "There is a lot of fabrication to make it all fit well, make cab mounting brackets, cut firewall for the engine clearance and shorten the frame for wheel spacing. The floor and firewall will be a challenge to make the swing pedals work for the clutch and brake pedals.

Once I get the body and all the components in place and aligned up and functioning, I will dissemble it totally, sandblast and do the body work and paint."

Some cleaning was needed!




Hhmm...a little difference in wheelbase!
