His thirst for knowledge led him to obtain a degree in Business Management from St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas, where he spent the next 48 years and raised his family.

Throughout his career, Greg made significant contributions to the microelectronics industry. He began his journey at RCA, serving as a member of the technical staff. He then became the Chief Engineer at Tracor, followed by a role as Director of Operations at Galaxy Microsystems for 12 years. Greg's expertise led him to XeTel, and he ultimately retired from ANSYS Inc. (DfR Solutions), where he excelled in technical sales and engineering.

Greg served as President and held numerous roles in the International Microelectronics Assembly & Packaging Society (iMAPS/ISHM) for many years. He was honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award, recognizing his exceptional impact on the microelectronics packaging industry.

Beyond his professional accomplishments, Greg's love for his family was unparalleled. He adored his wife, or as he called her his "child bride", June, and their recent celebration of 25 years of marriage was a testament to their enduring love. They reunited in 1997 through the North Plainfield High School class reunions (Greg was even inducted into the NPHS Hall of Fame).
