I posted on NextDoor and also sent out an email asking whether any of our neighbors who flooded needed help; however, no one has raised the white flag. Following is some storm recovery information from the City's Solid Waste Dept. This info is accurate as of Sept. 12th although there are updates practically daily so for current status please go to their website ... http://www.houstontx.gov/solidwaste/depositories.html -- or call 311.

- Due to disaster debris collection efforts, the only regularly scheduled solid waste service is weekly garbage collection. All other scheduled services – curbside recycling, yard waste recycling and heavy trash pick up – are suspended until further notice.
- You may still take your recycling to any of the Neighborhood Depository Centers or to the Westpark Recycling Center. Hours temporarily extended to 7 days a week, 8AM-8PM,

Also, several zip codes, including part of 77055, are affected by two wastewater treatment plants that flooded. We have been asked to conserve water to the extent possible in order to minimize wastewater overflow. Go to <u>https://houstonrecovers.org/</u> for current information.

THE IMPORTANCE OF USING 3-1-1

While most of our neighbors are wonderful people who take good care of their house and property, we do have the occasional owner or renter who doesn't.

Well, good news! We have deed restrictions and City ordinances (such as parking in the yard, tall grass, junk vehicle) which help to keep the neighborhood nice and protect our property values.

Deed restrictions are posted on our website and so is a map so you can identify your subdivision. The City's Code of Ordinances can be found at http://houstontx.gov/codes/.

Figuring out whether something is against a City ordinance can be challenging. 3-1-1 is our best friend. If you are unsure whether something is against a City ordinance, 3-1-1 can tell you. You can report to 3-1-1 via phone (dial 311 or 713-837-0311) or via email (311@houstontx.gov) or online at houstontx.gov/311/ or you can download the 311 app on your cellphone. You will receive a service request #. If you are having trouble getting action after reporting to 3-1-1, report it to CM Stardig's office via email (districta@houstontx.gov) and reference the # and please copy SBCA on that email.

If you have checked the deed restrictions and think there is a deed restriction violation, please let us know via email. If it is a restriction that is enforced by City Legal, it can be reported online at <u>http://www.houstontx.gov/legal/dr-complaint.html</u> or send an email to SBCA for action.

Lately, we've had a lot of new construction, and it is important for us to know what the building restrictions are. All of our subdivisions have minimum building setback lines and minimum lot sizes in the deed restrictions. These convenants are both enforced by City Legal. Please let SBCA know if you suspect there is an issue with new construction. A building setback would also apply to a remodel such as a room add-on and also carports. While there are many older carports that are "grandfathered", City Legal now enforces building setbacks on carports as well.

Please help us keep our neighborhood beautiful and raise awareness that there are deed restrictions and ordinances that are there to protect all of us.

ARE YOUR STREET HOUSE NUMBERS VISIBLE IN FRONT OF YOUR HOME ? by Virginia Gregory

The requirements of the City of Houston, Chapter 41 of the City Code of Ordinances, require that all homes have their street numbers visible in front of their homes.

This ordinance is enforced by the City of Houston Department of Public Works and Engineering and Sign Administration and Permits. These numbers have to be "Clearly visible from a public street in front of their homes or on a private driveway". Each residential unit shall have a number posted and maintained within 18 inches of the principle entrance or such greater distance as the fire marshall may approve.

This code was written for the protection of all residents. When emergency services are requested, this is the only way that the City of Houston Fire Department and Police Department, may dispatch assistance.

If your find that your home does not meet these specifications, we hope that you can do error correction quickly, for your own safety.
