REVIVING OUR LANDSCAPES WITH NATIVE TEXAS

PLANTS by Victoria Herrin

- Every challenge presents an opportunity, so if the weather has turned your lush, green landscape to an intolerably ugly brown, consider adding one or more of the cold hardy, early blooming Texas natives. Not only do they add color, they provide critically important nectar for the over-wintering and migrating hummingbirds. Some of the shrubs and vines may be available in the local nurseries or you can order seeds for the perennials from Native American Seed. Their website is http://www.seedsource.com/.
- Recommended native or adapted shrubs include Cape Honeysuckle (*Tecomaria capensis*) and Texas Flowering Quince (*Chaenomeles japonica*). Early blooming native vines include Carolina Jessamine (*Gelsemium sempervirens*), Wisteria (*Wisteria frutescens*), and Coral Honeysuckle (*Lonicera sempervirens*). Perennials include Gulf Coast Penstemon and Mealy Blue Sage.

TIPS FOR TRASH DAY

- Per the City of Houston Solid Waste Department, our ٠ rolling trash/recycle bins are supposed to be placed "at the curb" (not in the street) between 6PM the day before and 7AM on the scheduled collection day.
- Containers must be removed from the curbline ٠ and/or public view by 10PM on the day of collection.
- Also, the containers are emptied via hydraulic arms ٠ that come out from the truck and wrap around the container to pick it up and dump the contents. So, if

your containers are too close to one another or too close to anything else, the arms can't do their job. And the drivers aren't supposed to get out of the truck to move a bin. So if you've ever wondered why your trash wasn't emptied, this might be the problem.

SPEAKING OF FLOODING

- Keeping storm drains clear help us all when we get downpours.
- All of the leaves are off the trees now and in the street gutters and clogging storm drains.
- It helps us all if everyone would pitch in to keep street gutters and storm drains clear.
