WOODVIEW ELEMENTARY GROUNDBREAKING: The 2017 Bond Program provided funds to include the complete rebuild of ten SBISDschools, including Woodview Elementary. Woodview students were relocated after the 2022 Fall Semester, and groundbreaking for our new school took place January 2023. It is estimated that construction will take 18-20 months and students are expected to return to Woodview in the Fall of 2024. Woodview was constructed in 1958 and totals 70,508 SF serving appx. 600 students. The new campus will have appx. 100,000 SF and will be able to serve up to 700 students. SBCA Board Members Caroline Horsley and Charmaine Bixler served on the Project Advisory Team and attended numerous meetings last year to participate in the planning.
