OAK TREE PARK: Volunteers work regularly on our park at 1441 Oak Tree which SBCA adopted from the City of

Houston earlier in the year. We meet at 8 AM on the 2nd Tuesday and the 4th Saturday of every month and spend a couple of hours at the most. Come when you can and do what you can. <u>DEED RESTRICTIONS:</u> Residents should be aware of deed restrictions which are in place for all homes within SBCA. If everyone at least keeps an eye out for their subdivision, we can keep deed restriction violations to a minimum and maintain the integrity of the restrictions. Go to our website -- <u>www.springbranchcivic.com</u> – for a copy of the deed restrictions. Deed restrictions are also recorded in Harris County Deed Records. The City of Houston Legal Dept. enforces some of the covenants, such as minimum lot size, building setback, and usage (such as residential only). Click on the following link for more information about City Legal and this process –

https://www.houstontx.gov/legal/deed.html. Residents should be proactive about deed restrictions. Please familiarize yourself with your restrictions.

CITY ORDINANCES: There are also City of Houston Ordinances which we should be aware of such as an overgrown yard, heavy trash at curb before allowed, junk cars, etc. Violations of a City ordinance should be reported to 3-1-1 by phone or email or online. There is a 311 app now! This neighborhood is the responsibility of all residents and we need the help of all residents to protect our investment.

CITY OF HOUSTON TRASH PICK UP & RECYCLING: Heavy trash pick up for our neighborhood is on the 4th Wednesday of every month. Junk waste is picked up on "even" numbered months. Tree waste is picked up on "odd" numbered months. If you put out junk waste on an odd month, the City will not pick it up! SEPTEMBER IS A TREE WASTE ONLY MONTH!! Recycling (green bin) is picked up every other Friday. Also, every Friday, the City picks up "yard waste" which could be bags of leaves (only in City approved compostable plastic bags) and small bundled limbs. More information about heavy trash and

PLACEMENT OF TRASH & RECYCLE BINS: The garbage & recycle trucks are equipped with automatic "arms" that pick up the bins to dump the contents into the back of the truck. If your bins are placed too closely together, there is not room for the "arms." You can find Curbside Collection Guidelines on the City's Solid Waste web page (houstontx.gov/solidwaste) under Department Rules & Regulations. Basically though, the bins should be at the curb (NOT in the street) with the handle facing the house, and with at least 3 feet of space all the way around each bin.
