STREET GUTTERS & STORM DRAINS

We can all do our part in helping to alleviate flooding by keeping street gutters and storm drains clear of debris. During a heavy rainfall, everything in the street will head toward the storm drains. Trash or an accumulation of leaves will clog the storm drain and the storm sewer lines thereby slowing drainage. The City has an Adopt-A-Drain program for storm drains so that we can individually contribute to efforts to reduce local street flooding by adopting a storm drain and being responsible to keep it free from leaves and trash. DEED RESTRICTIONS

All of the subdivisions within Spring Branch Civic Association ("SBCA") are subject to deed restrictions which define everything from building setbacks to minimum lot size to single family residential use only to no livestock!! These are covenants that were established when our neighborhood was developed. They are filed in Harris County Deed Records and they automatically renew. No entity can grant a variance to a deed restriction -- not SBCA, not the City of Houston, not the State of Texas. The only way to get around a deed restriction is to file an amendment which requires the approval of at least 50% of property owners. The City of Houston Legal Department enforces some of the deed restrictions, but not all, so the integrity of our deed restrictions depends in large part to individual homeowners. Because a deed restriction is a covenant among property owners within a subdivision, one property owner can file a lawsuit against another property owner for violation of a deed restriction.

Please familiarize yourself with the deed restrictions for your subdivision. Restrictions are intended to keep the neighborhood nice and to maintain property values. If you identify what you believe to be a violation of a deed restriction, please report it to the SBCA Board via email at sbcivicassn@gmail.com; and we will follow up on it with you. Deed restrictions are posted to our website -www.springbranchcivic.com. SBCA subdivisions: Long Point Woods, Sections 1, 2 & 3; Spring Branch Woods, Sections 1, 2 & 3; Bunker Hill Forest, Sections 1 & 2; Century Oaks; and Spring Manor Town Houses.

REVIEW OF DEED RESTRICTIONS

Our sleepy little neighborhood has been discovered and investors are snapping up houses and holding them as rentals or tearing down the original structure and building something much larger. There are many large lots within SBCA and investors will try to subdivide or build something prohibited by deed restrictions. Our deed restrictions in some cases have paragraphs that are not written so as to make the intent clear. Example: Paragraph 4 in Long Point Woods 1. Several residents have agreed to help review deed restrictions and identify such language. However, each subdivision will have to be responsible for getting the requisite number of signatures. This project is not intended to overhaul deed restrictions! It is only intended to identify language that should be clarified. BRIAR BRANCH CHANNEL IMPROVEMENTS

Construction has begun on the Briar Branch Channel Improvements by TIRZ 17. The improvements to Briar Branch include installing large box culverts to replace the current open channel. These box culverts provide a larger cross-section than the existing open channel, thus increasing its conveyance capacity. In addition to the channel improvements, this project will also construct the "straws," which consist of 2,600 linear feet of storm sewer improvements perpendicular to Briar Branch. These "straws" include the construction of significant box storm sewers under Windhover Lane and Springrock Lane, which will also increase the conveyance capacity of the storm sewer network.

According to the March 2019 progress report, the noticeto-proceed date for this project was December 17, 2018, and the contract time is 24 months with a projected completion date of November 30, 2020. The contractor is Reytec Construction Resources. The construction manager is Gauge Engineering, and the design engineer is RPS Klotz Associates. The contract amount is \$18,794,957, while \$1,014,701 has been spent to date.

The progress report states that box culvert construction has begun, and door hangers have been provided to residents that will be impacted by the next phase of construction. For more information, please visit http://www.houstontirz17.org/projects/.
