Road transport	Clipping overhead powerlines and trees, falling off side of narrow bridges, hitting people, cars, structures	Arrange a Pilot vehicle if oversized and ensure all oversize signs and lights are working. Drive slowly and cautiously on roads and through towns. Do not pass under any low-lying power lines or trees.

Operating Procedures

Pre-Operational Safety Checks	 Ensure the Tractor meets all requirements to operate the Implement being attached to PTO and three-point linkage. Ensure Implement is in good operating condition. Ensure all protective shields/guards are in place & in working order. Check for broken or worn parts and report damages. Check all tyre pressures & ensure tyres are not damaged, cracked or spiked. Inbringto all hybrigation points on part Implement Operator Manual.
	Lubricate all lubrication points as per Implement Operator Manual.

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•	Check for loose bolts.
•	Check hydraulic oil level. Check for hydraulic leaks. (If applicable)
•	Visually examine all parts on the Implement being attached.
	DO NOT OPERATE A FAULTY MACHINE.
	REPORT IT IMMEDIATELY TO THE MANAGER & TAG OUT OF ORDER

	• Ensure the Attachment is on flat and level ground, and no one is around.

	• Follow the Attachment Operating Manual for correct folding procedure before attachment and transportation.
	• Locate the controls in the tractor for operation of the hydraulics on the loader arms. Move the controls to test movement of loader arms and tilt operations.
	• Reverse tractor up to Attachment slowly and lower arms down to same height and give a slight crowd angle.
Connecting Attachments to a Tractor	• Lift/align loader arms on loader onto top securing lugs of Attachment and lift up and crowd back arms to allow attachment to enter bottom securing position.
	• Lift the loader to about 50 cm off the ground and apply the hand brake. Put the tractor in neutral and turn the engine off.
	Manually insert pins.
	Ensure that all locking devices and pins are in place.
	• Make sure all lights work and appropriate signage such as "oversize" signs are clearly displayed. Arrange for a vehicle escort if Attachment is oversized.
Transporting Attachments	Keep in communication over UHF radio with an escort vehicle.
	 Road speed should not exceed speed stated in the Implement Operating Manual and drive to conditions.
	• Be aware of overhead power lines, uneven edges of roads and the width of the Implement when passing vehicles, buildings and road obstacles.
	On arrival to the paddock, ensure the Implement and Tractor is on flat and level
	ground and away from trees before unfolding
