


This is Home

This is not an image of anyone in particular, just a man on an unpictured horse putting his hat back on. I believe that he is one of my first successes when it comes to human anatomy and painting.



Popcorn Chicken April 2024




This piece currently resides on the wall of Pop City Popcorn for public viewing.




