hey, where did the lamp go? (2025) – NYC – the Great Hall Theater (MMC)

As a part of my senior thesis, this work explores the duality of emotions that exist in the book of Psalms from the Old Testament of the Bible. More specifically, it poses the question of “what do you do when you feel like God is not there anymore?” I think of this work more as a conversation with my younger self when it was easier to have faith because I didn’t know how much hurt the world can cause.

These bags between us (2025) - NYC – the Great Hall Theater (MMC)

This work was performed at Marymount Manhattan College (NYC) at the Spring 2025 Student Choreography Concert. With Elisabeth Motley as my advisor and fellow students as the dancers/collaborators, this work focused on how our own personal baggage can affect our interactions with each other. We had lots of discussions and creation sessions that centered around the conversation of what emotions and burdens we carry with us daily and how these heavy topics can affect the people who are closest to us.

In loving memory of nostalgia (2024) - NYC – the Great Hall Theater (MMC)

This work was performed at MMC (NYC) at Works in Progress, a student run performance. The overall concept of this piece was about how the things and places of our childhood might have seemed so happy and joyous, but as we grow up, we discover more of the dark things that made these things up. The collaborators and I discussed mostly how our childhood T.V shows would have so much more gone on behind the scenes than we as kids knew about and how knowing these things now affects how we view our growing up.

paradigm shift (2024) - NYC – Screen dance

Featured at MMC's Screenplay (NYC) club, a club dedicated to dance on film works,

paradigm shift focused on the legacy that so many popular artists have left us.

Throughout this process, the dancers and I discussed the fact that what makes us artists now are the artists and performers that have inspired us. We take a little piece of these creators wherever we go. This work was about honoring them.

As the leaves change so do, we (2023) - NYC – Screen dance

As a part of Elisabeth Motley's Composition 3 class, this work was a dance on film that used a poem as a score for the choreography. Both the poem and choreography were created by me, and we touched on the topics of seasons changing but certain things staying the same.

Metro (2022) - Hilton Head, SC – Seahawks Cultural Arts Center

This work touched on the topic of human interaction on a broad scale. Specifically, the setting for this piece was the subways of New York. The dancers and I discussed how

we as humans all live totally different lives, but because we are human, we are actually very similar.

Telescope (2021) – Hilton Head, SC – Screen dance

This piece was my senior year thesis to receive my diploma with distinction in dance. This piece touches on the science of how all the planets and stars (that are visible) relate to one another. The placement and format of the dancers was based on proximity to where the planets are placed from the point of view of a telescope on Earth. With a cast of about 15 dancers/collaborators, the genre of this work was a contemporary ballet piece for pointe.
