CHAPTER 1
TRAFFIC CODE

SECTION:

6-1-1: **State Vehicle Code Adopted**
6-1-2: **Penalty**

6-1-1: **STATE VEHICLE CODE ADOPTED:** The Illinois vehicle code, 625 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/1-101 et seq., as amended, is hereby adopted and incorporated into this title by reference and shall be applicable in the village the same as if each provision of the said Illinois vehicle code were specifically set forth at length herein. Three (3) copies of the Illinois vehicle code are on file in the office of the village clerk for public use and inspection. (2007 Code)

6-1-2: **PENALTY:** Any person who violates any provision of the Illinois vehicle code, as amended, and as the same has been adopted as a part of this village code, within the village, shall be subject to the penalties provided in section 1-4-1 of this code. (2007 Code)

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CHAPTER 2
PARKING REGULATIONS

SECTION:

6-2-1: Parking Commercial Vehicles In Residence Districts

6-2-1: PARKING COMMERCIAL VEHICLES IN RESIDENCE DISTRICTS:

- A. Parking Prohibited:** No person shall park or leave standing on any street or portion thereof in a residence district as defined by the zoning ordinance of the village, any commercial vehicle (excluding vehicles exclusively used for transporting school children) having a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand (10,000) pounds or more.
- B. Exceptions:** The prohibition hereby imposed shall not apply to the parking or standing of such a vehicle for the purpose of making pick ups or deliveries from or to any building or structure located within such residence district, or for the purpose of delivering materials to be used in the repair, alteration, remodeling or construction of any such building or structure for which a building permit has been obtained.
- C. Penalty:** Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this section shall be fined not less than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
