

# HIGHLAND COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY CAMPING RULES

(OUTSIDE OF FAIR WEEK)

The following rules are set in place to assure the safety of all parties involved during your stay in the fair grounds. We require RV contained camping and it includes water and electric hook up with one camper per site. If any of the following rules are not followed you will be asked to leave the grounds and refund of payments will not be given.

1. COVID-19 Responsible Restart Ohio revised 5/14/20, or most recent communication, will be adhered to.
2. The person renting the campsite must be an adult residing at the campsite and be responsible for the behavior and welfare of all other members staying at the campsite.
3. NO outside refrigerators which are not part of the camper
4. Intoxication, profane, or vulgar language, excessive noise, or disorderly conduct of any type will not be tolerated. Any of these are sufficient reasons for eviction from the camping areas and fairgrounds without refund or unused fees.
5. Camping areas must be quieted by 12 am-midnight and campers must be on their respective lots by then. Any person not observing the curfew time may be evicted.
6. One camping unit per lot, NO TENT CAMPING. No one is permitted to sleep in their auto.
7. Solid waste, garbage, cans, and paper is to be disposed of in trash barrels. Absolutely NO leaking of gray or black water. Use dump station located next to the RED Gate, near Rt. 73 exit, to dispose of black & gray water.
8. No grilling, cooking, fire rings, or other sources of open flames are permitted under awnings or canopies.
9. Fire rings, if used, must be self-contained and elevated. Camper must provide own fire ring. NO trash to be placed in fire and ashes are to be dumped in designated metal trash cans provided by the HCAS.
10. Failure to use assigned campsite or transfer of site without the permission of the HCAC's written approval WILL result in loss of camping privileges.
11. Bicycles are allowed on the fairgrounds and camping areas. Golf carts/ gators are permitted but must be driven responsibly by a person 18 yr. or older with a valid driver's license. Motorized vehicles can only be driven on roadways and paved areas on the grounds, violators may be asked to leave the camping event.
12. Camping locations will be determined by the Camping Supervisor. When you arrive and before you set up, please visit office/ supervisor to check in and receive your camping permit and itinerary.
13. All campers are to use potable drinking water approved hoses at the campsites.
