All industries and technologies are ripe for change over time, Change can be mostly slow but also sometimes abrupt.

Tesla, Intel and Peloton are facing this challenge.

If you build a better mouse trap, people will build a path to your door, Wrong, ideas must be sold and adapted. The best technologies do not always win the day.

Anthony Rizzi PhD Physicist, created a new term "Philosophical-Idealist." This refers to ideas not tested or grounded in reality.

- . I.e. Everyone must drive an EV by 1935, Wrong
- DOE estimate is 24 %. Toyota estimate is maximum of 30 %.

You might appreciate this talk, it partially explains why NASA is hopelessly behind, vastly out performed by NASA scientists 50 years back. BI

What is a philosophical idealist? From the Science before Science," Philosophical idealism is the belief that one's knowledge starts with thought rather than things (376). Philosophical idealists believe they can go back and second guess the accuracy of sensorial knowledge. Users of this system of thought must forget that all knowledge comes to us through the senses. Such systems of thought lock oneself in one's head. People who adhere to philosophical idealism are called philosophical idealists (39). Physidst Anthony Rizzi

Bejan another physicist has an additional explanation.

"Compared with the advanced person who uses modern equipment, the thinker with a straight edge and compass may strike us as backward, or prehistoric. This impression is false and damaging to education. The person who learns to use the ancient tools is equipping himself or herself with the discipline: how to think most simply and directly, how to deliver the coup de grace while arguing scientifically, how to disarm the skeptic, and how to design even better modern instruments for the graphics needed today" (82).
