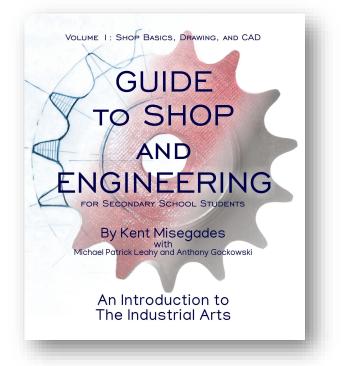

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


#### **Engineering with a Biblical Worldview**

### **Definitions:**

- **3D Printing** the action or process of making a physical object from a three-dimensional digital model, typically by laying down many thin layers of a material in succession.
- **Additive Manufacturing** structures are made by the addition of thousands of minuscule layers which combine to create the product. The process typically involves the use of a computer and special software which can relay messages to the printer so it "prints" in the desired shape.
- **Computer-Aided Design (CAD)** the use of computers to create 2D and 3D designs. Common types of CAD include two-dimensional drawings and layout design and three-dimensional modeling.
- **Computer-Aided Engineering (CAE)** the use of computer software to simulate performance in order to improve product designs or assist in the resolution of engineering problems for a wide range of industries. This includes simulation, validation and optimization of products, processes, and manufacturing tools.
- **Computer-Aided Manufacturing (CAM)** the use of software and computer-controlled machinery to automate a manufacturing process.
- **Computer Numerical Control (CNC)** the automated control of machining tools and 3D printers by means of a computer. A CNC machine processes a piece of material to meet specifications by following a coded programmed instruction and without a manual operator directly controlling the machining operation. G-code and M-code commands provide instructions to CNC machinery.
- **Subtractive Manufacturing** traditional manufacturing methods involving material being carved or shaped into the desired product by parts of it being removed in a variety of ways.







## **A Brief History of CAD**








- CAD was born as a direct result of the Soviet Union's first atomic bomb, the RDS-1, in 1949. Following this, the United States embarked on a massive defense program called SAGE (Semi-Automatic Ground Environment).
- Information from radar systems across North America (and on "Texas Towers" out in the ocean) was fed into the world's largest computers, the **AN/FSQ-7**, built by IBM at a cost of \$10b. in 1954 (\$97b in 2020).
- SAGE was the first computer system to use interactive graphic displays, called CRTs (Cathode Ray Tubes). Operators could select a target (blip of light) on the screen to get details on it and, if necessary, could initiate a course of action, including shoot-down by jet interceptors or ground-based missiles.





## **A Brief History of CAD**








- One of the many smart young engineers involved with SAGE was Ivan Edward Sutherland (left) from Hastings, Nebraska. Among his many contributions was **SKETCHPAD**, the subject of his Ph.D. work at MIT in 1963. Sutherland developed the light **pen** as well as the interactive computer programs employed by SAGE and is considered the **Father of Computer Graphics**.
- Sutherland continued his research into interactive computer graphics at Harvard, the University of Utah and California **Institute of Technology**, where he and his students made countless important breakthroughs in computing technology that spawned companies such as Adobe, Evans and Sutherland, Pixar, Silicon Graphics and Sun Microsystems.
- Early in his career Sutherland collaborated with engineers at **General Motors** to apply his work to the practical application of computerized drafting. When the company **Autodesk** introduced the first CAD product AutoCAD in 1982, it was quickly adopted by the automotive industry.



So Why Are **Today's Best Manufacturers Adopting Full-Cloud CAD?** 



MIT's Jon Hirschtick saw the opportunity to use the latest Windows-based PCs for CAD in the early 1990s and formed SolidWorks Corporation in December 1993, resulting in the release of their first product, **SolidWorks 95** approximately two years later.


- Numerous companies today offer CAD packages, as shown in the previous slides. Most are designed for **specific markets**. Compared to early computerized drawing programs focused on **2D drawings**, CAD programs today are called **Solid Modelers**. Users create their designs from the outset as three-dimensional parts. Parts are then combined to make assemblies.
- CAD developers have more recently taken advantage of **cloud** computing. For instance former SolidWorks CEOs Jon Hirschtick and John McEleney established the company Onshape in November 2012 with the goal of taking full advantage of emerging cloud computing. In December 2015, Onshape launched its first full commercial release.

### Ivan Edward Sutherland



#### **▲ 3-D trip inside a drawing, via computer graphics**

Slip this display device on your head and you see a computergenerated 3-D image of a room before your eyes. Move your head and your perspective changes, just as though you were actually inside the room. Architects could use the device to draw buildings in three dimensions; realtors could use it to show buyers the interiors of homes without even leaving the office. Dr. Ivan Sutherland, University of Utah, invented the device, essentially a computer-graphics version of the old stereoscope.



Dr. Ivan Sutherland, decades ahead of his time, is rightfully called 'The father of computer graphics.' When asked, "How could you possibly have done the first interactive graphics program, the first nonprocedural programming language, the first object-oriented software system, all in one year?" He replied: "Well, I didn't know it was hard."














- Once you have completed Onshape Fundamentals lessons, test your knowledge by recreating the orthographic drawings from the chapters on sketching and drawings.


#### American Inventor – Hobart "Hobie" Alter



- Born in **1933** in Ontario, CA. His father, **Hobart Romig Alter** was a WWI veteran, second-generation orange grower and member of the California legislature whose family immigrated to the US in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century from **Darmstadt**, Germany.
- During his teenage years, the Alter family spent the summers in their home in Laguna Beach on Gaviota Drive, directly off the Oak Street Beach of the Pacific Ocean.
- At age 14, Hobie became interested in the new sport of surfing. Lacking surf shops where he could buy one, he used his **school** woodshop skills and love of woodworking to construct his first board, made from balsa wood. Based on traditional designs from Hawaii, the board was nine feet long, huge by today's standard.
- At age 17, Hobie started a business in the Laguna Beach home garage, adding other "shapers" to keep up with demand. Running out of room at home, and with the support of his father, Hobie opened America's Hobie Surf Shop in Dana Point in **1954, at age 21.** It was one of the first such shops in the USA.



#### American Inventor – Hobart "Hobie" Alter



- In the 1950s, the large aerospace industry in southern California made increasing use of **fiberglass materials**. With balsa becoming scarce and demand for boards increasing, several groups began experimenting with it for surfboards.
- In 1958 Hobie, a self-taught, innovative engineer, working with one of his shapers, Gordon "Grubby" Clark, developed the first such foam and fiberglass boards, which were lighter, faster and more responsive than wooden ones. Clark went on to establish "Clark Foam", which remained a major supplier of foam blanks to the industry for the next 50 years.
- In 1959, Columbia Pictures released the first of the "Gidget" (Girl-Midget) series of popular movies focused on teenage surfing. This resulted in rapid growth in industry, which could only have been met through the new foam/fiberglass production methods from Hobie. (The Gidget movies were based on the true story of Kathy Kohner Zuckerman, written by her father, playwright Frederick Kohner.)



#### American Inventor – Hobart "Hobie" Alter




- While attending a boat show in 1961, when Hobie was 28, Hobie's booth was by chance located next to a maker of catamaran sailboats. Interested in the novel design, based on Polynesian sailboats, Hobie began development of what would become the **Hobie Cat** line of sailboats, first introduced in **1967**.
- Hobie Cats could be easily transported by trailer, were relatively light stable and fast. As with surfing a decade earlier, Hobie revolutionized sailing, making it more affordable, safe and fun for more people. The Hobie Cat is the world's most popular cat.
- In the subsequent decades with Hobie and his sons running his business, Alter developed many popular products including skateboards, radio-controlled model aircraft (Hobie Hawk), MirageDrive—pedal-powered underwater kayaks, sunglasses, stand-up paddleboards and pedalboards, and others.
- As a **teenager**, Hobie and his friends discussed their **plans for** life: "Instead of talking about what we might do, let's first came up with a list of rules: "We won't wear suits and ties, we won't wear hard shoes, and we won't work regular hours that might interrupt our surf time."

### Hobie – The Ideal Startup Company



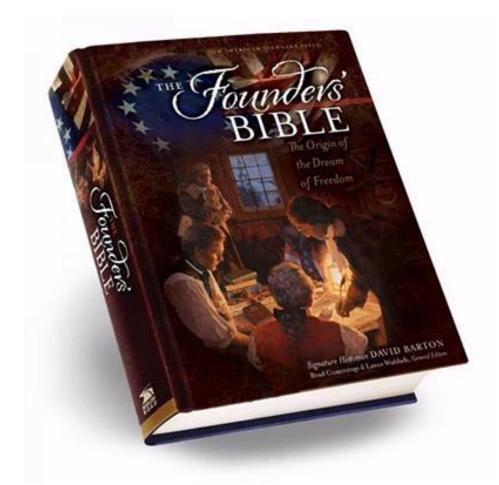


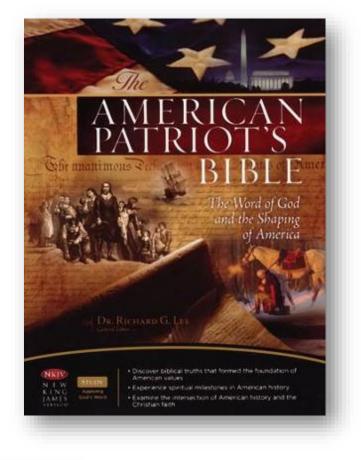


- As a boy, Hobart Alter enjoyed **outdoor sports**, especially in the summers at the family's home directly on the Pacific ocean beach. He also enjoyed woodworking, which he learned in school and practiced in the family garage.
- Through a friend, Hobie tried surfing, and liked it. Since surf shops did not yet exist, he was forced to make his own surfboard from balsa wood and using his **woodworking skills and tools**.
- When his teenage friends asked him to make them a surfboard, a **business was born** in the family garage and across their yard.
- Hobie's parents supported their son's God-given passion, and his entrepreneurship. Instead of forcing him to attend college after high school, they loaned him the money needed for his **first surf shop** on nearby Dana Point, popular with surfers.
- Hobie's friends became his first business partners, sharing his passion for water sports and making a business by providing others with affordable boards and other surfing-related products, such as skateboards, sailboats, sunglasses, kayaks, etc.
- Hobie and his colleagues **never stopped innovating**, the secret to a successful, long-term business. Why not do the same?





- While computer-based design and engineering tools have helped engineers lacksquareimprove productivity and product quality dramatically in recent decades, they are no substitute for first knowing the fundamentals. Compare this to your own maturation as a human being: starting as a helpless infant, progressing to crawling, eventually walking, running, cycling, driving and perhaps one day rocketing to the moon. Can humans today achieve success without first mastering the fundamentals of life *and* faith? American engineers sent men to the moon long before CAD and similar tools existed. How was this possible?
- The Amish and Mennonites in America are famous for hard-working families,  $\bullet$ productive farms and successful businesses that have a Biblical worldview. - Hobart "Hobie" Alter started his company while still in high school and did not  $\bullet$ attend college. Yet he was one of the most innovate designers of watersports products in the world. How was he able to achieve success with such a modest start? What roles did his hobbies, family and friends play?
