



Work & Education

A CHALLENGE TO YOU


- What are your God-given gifts and abilities? We all have them, but only some people follow them.

- Can you obtain the needed education outside of government K-12 schools and formal/expensive college study? (the answer is probably YES).






What Proverbs 31:10-31 Says:



2:1 But as for you, speak the things which are proper for sound doctrine: 2 that the older men be sober, reverent, temperate, sound in faith, in love, in patience; 3 the older women likewise, that they be reverent in behavior, not slanderers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things— 4 that they admonish the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, 5 to be discreet, chaste, **homemakers**, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be blasphemed. 6 Likewise, **exhort the young men** to be sober-minded, 7 in all things showing yourself to be a pattern of good works; in doctrine showing integrity, reverence, incorruptibility, 8 sound speech that cannot be condemned, that one who is an opponent may be ashamed, having nothing evil to say of you.



What 2 Timothy 3:14-17 Says:

3:14 But you must continue in the things which you have **learned** and been assured of, knowing from whom you have **learned** them, 15 and that from **childhood** you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.




