

Sportsmanship Rule

No exhibitor will visit or socialize with a judge the day of the show. Furthermore, exhibitors shall not approach judges for any reason prior to or after the completion of judging unless a request is made to show management and with the ring steward or other show official present.

Conduct by judges, IHA members and non-members, volunteers, exhibitors, trainers, owners (and their representatives), spectators and all other persons present on the show grounds or in show facilities shall be orderly, responsible, sportsmanlike, courteous and respectful. Direct abusive and threatening conduct while on the show grounds will not be tolerated and the offending person(s) may be asked to leave the show grounds in order to preserve the decorum of the show.

A violation of either of these rules will first result in a written warning from the show committee to the party(s) involved in the initial violation, which shall also be forwarded to the IHA Board, within five (5) days of the incident; a second violation of these rules will be brought to the IHA Board for review and any action will be left up to their discretion, which may include but not be limited to removal of points earned on the date of the incident, disciplinary action and/or suspension from IHA club activities for a period of time to be determined by the IHA Board.

2019 GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All classes being offered herein will be conducted and run in accordance with the Islip Horsemen's Association rules and regulations and the current USEF Rule Book unless otherwise specified. IHA rules will be available for reference.

2. Pre-entries will be taken by phone until 9:00 PM the Thursday preceding the show date. Mailed entries, regular or E-mailed, are the responsibilities of the entrant and must be received by the above deadline. No one will be permitted to perform without payment of all fees. All exhibitors must sign a release form and a parent/guardian's signature is required for all Junior riders.

3. After closing dates there will be no refunds without a licensed Veterinarian's Certificate of the horse's unsoundness or a Doctor's note of the rider's inability to perform. Notes are to be submitted to the show committee within 10 days!

4. Show starts promptly at 9:00 AM. In the event of class cancellation, refunds will be made by mail.

5. Proper English attire is required in all classes. An ASTM/SEI approved helmet must be worn by all mounted riders. Half chaps not permitted. No refunds will be given for incorrect attire.

6. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide or move any class. Classes with less than 3 entries may be combined or cancelled.

7. All participants and spectators enter premises and ride at their own risk. IHA, Suffolk County, and or the show committee disclaim liability for any accident or occurrence, no matter what the cause.

8 Schooling will be permitted on the jumping courses from 7:30 to 8:45 AM and during lunch breaks as follows: Any rider with a hard hat, 6 riders at a time for once around the course. Schooling fee is \$5.00 per rider and must be paid to the gatekeeper.

9. A rider's age will be determined as of the previous December 1.

10. Division eligibility of the rider at first show shall remain the same for the entire season. An IHA show season consists of any or all IHA shows within a calendar year commencing January 1 and ending December 31.

11. If a trainer enters the ring with an entrant, the entrant will be disqualified. Verbal assistance is also cause for disqualification. No one may approach a judge at any time without permission from the ring steward.

12. Martingales are not permitted in any flat classes. Flashes will not be permitted in equitation or hunters. Boots, bandages or wraps are not permitted in Hunter divisions. Black stirrups are not allowed in equitation classes. See IHA rule book for more details.

13. A one-minute rule to enter the ring will be strictly enforced. Trainer conflicts will not be honored. There will be a 10-minute time limit enforced on holding a class due to rider/horse conflicts.

14. Classes with less than 3 riders will not be eligible for year end awards.

15. A trophy and six ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Champion Ribbon and Trophy and Reserve ribbon will be awarded in each division. Junior and Adult Grand Champion and Reserve Ribbons will be awarded to the high point horse and rider combinations of the day. *See Rule 10*

The Bohemia Equestrian Center is located on Sycamore Avenue, 1/4 mile south of Veterans Hwy and 2 miles north of Sunrise Hwy. in Bohemia. It is on the Northeast corner of Connetquot Park.			

16. Should a question or dispute arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be put in writing the day of the show and referred to the show management, whose decision shall be final.

17. Trainers may not ride in equitation divisions. Amateur Eligibility Rule: To those who have not received payment to show, judge, train, or assist in training a horse whether monetary or otherwise, either directly or indirectly, (with the exception of therapeutic trainers) nor received payment whether monetary or otherwise for instructing a person in riding, driving, training or showing a horse for 5 calendar years prior to application for amateur membership, regardless of discipline. Amendment to Rule #36 in rule book. Any rider with the exception of trainers may go from one discipline to another without instruction as to what division they should enter. It shall be left to the rider's discretion.

18. If taken off show ground by ambulance, you may not return that day to resume participation in the show.

19. IHA horseshows are ADA compliant.

The Northeast Equestrian Series (NES) is a schooling show series located on Long Island. The series is founded on the principle of bringing the local horse community together through safe competition, comradery, and horse/rider development. The horse show divisions are hosted at the following equestrian facilities; Hidden Pond Stables, Bohemia Equestrian Center (managed by Islip Horseman's Association), Old Field Farm, and Country Farms. All registered participants in Northeast Equestrian Series divisions are eligible to compete at the NES Finals held at Old Field Farm each fall. NES riders and horses are also eligible for yearend awards based on the accumulation of points throughout the show season. The celebration of the horses, riders and awards is held during the Annual Northeast Equestrian Series Banquet.

General Information / Rules & Regulations

1. Riders must compete in a minimum of **four** shows; **one** at each facility to be eligible for a year end award.

2. Riders wishing to be eligible for a year end award with Northeast Equestrian Series are required to pay a **\$10** fee at each show attended **per division** in order for points to be counted.

3. Points are equally valued at each show. 1st-7pts, 2nd-5pts, 3rd-4pts, 4th-3pts, 5th-2pts, and 6th-1pt

4. Trainers, coaches and riders are to use discretion when choosing divisions in order to ensure fairness to all participants.

5. Moving up; if a rider receives a champion or reserve in either Junior or Adult beginner for two consecutive years, they will no longer be eligible for those divisions.

6. In order to qualify for the Northeast Equestrian Series Finals held at Oldfield Farm on September 29th, you are required to receive a **Champion** or **Reserve Champion** in your division or accumulate **65 points.**

7. All divisions at the IHA shows except Jr. Maiden & Ad. Maiden qualify for the NES.

ENGLISH END OF YEAR AWARDS REQUIREMENTS

High point awards will be given to the same horse and rider combinations of the three show series. To be eligible for these awards, exhibitors **must be paid members by the end of the first show**; horse and rider must attend all three IHA English Shows. No Exceptions.

IHA DIVISION AWARDS

To be eligible for IHA Year End Division Awards, the rider must be a member by the conclusion of the first show entered. Exhibitors must amass a minimum of 10 points and attend two of the three English shows and compete in two of the three classes in the division to qualify for year end division awards. Veterinarian's or Doctor's notes must be submitted within 10 days of the show to the secretary for a pardon from that particular show. See IHA Rules and Regulations for further information on Year End Awards. End of year ribbons awarded up to sixth place. In case of conflicts with year end awards, the rider must submit proof of membership (membership card or cancelled check)

TRAINER AWARD

Trainers will specify one division in three of these four categories: Equitation, Hunter, Pleasure and/or Jumpers. **Then they will choose which rider in each who will represent them prior to the start of the show.** The same rider may be selected for any or all of the divisions. All points accumulated by the specified rider or riders in the specified divisions will be tallied over the season for the Trainer Series Award. Participants must be IHA members.

Points awarded to horse regardless of rider.

PUDDLE JUMPER: Open to any horse or pony. Fences 2'3".

43. Power and Speed: USEF rules apply. Time does not apply for the first portion of the class If a horse/pony is clean, time begins as the horse/pony crosses the finish line of the 1st portion of the course.

44. **Timed First Round:** Timed first round over designated course, major faults to count. USEF rules apply.

45. Timed First Jump Off: To compete over designated course in a time allowed. Major faults to count. USEF Rules apply.

Stakes Class (#45): To be eligible for stakes class, horse must be entered in the entire division. If entries are less than 5, only first and second places will receive prize money.

JUNIOR HUNT SEAT EQUITATION

Starting in 2020, Leadline and Pre-Special Beginner will not be eligible for Year End High Point Awards. This does not affect Year End Division Awards.

Points awarded to rider regardless of horse.

LEADLINE: Open to riders 8 and under who have not shown in any classes requiring riders to walk, trot and/or canter independently. Open to horses and ponies only. Riders cannot cross enter into any other division. Side walkers are allowed.






