Special Rebate: For every 5 classes entered by the same horse/rider combination, 6th class will be free. **REBATE DOES NOT APPLY TO POST ENTRIES** **If you are joining or renewing your membership at the show, please use separate check for annual dues**

Show Day: Check-in begins at approximately 8:00 am. Classes will begin promptly at 9:00 am.

Each horse/rider combination will be given one set (2) of numbers for the entire show season. If the number is lost or misplaced, it is the rider's responsibility to replace it with the same number. Numbers are not to be shared or changed during the show season and must be displayed prominently during competition

DIRECTIONS: Show grounds are located 1 mile south of Veterans Highway (Rt 454), and 3 miles North of Sunrise Highway (Rt 27) adjacent to Connetquot Park.

No exhibitor will visit or socialize with a judge the day of the show. Furthermore, exhibitors shall not approach judges for any reason prior to or after the completion of judging unless a request is made to show management and with the ring steward or other show official present.

Conduct by judges, IHA members and non-members, volunteers, exhibitors, trainers, owners (and their representatives), spectators and all other persons present on the show grounds or in show facilities shall be orderly, responsible, sportsmanlike, courteous and respectful. Direct abusive and threatening conduct while on the show grounds will not be tolerated and the offending person(s) may be asked to leave the show grounds in order to preserve the decorum of the show.

A violation of either of these rules will first result in a written warning from the show committee to the party(is) involved in the initial violation, which shall also be forwarded to the IHA Board, within five (5) days of the incident; a second violation of these rules will be brought to the IHA Board for review and any action will be left up to their discretion, which may include but not be limited to removal of points earned on the date of the incident, disciplinary action and/or suspension from IHA club activities for a period of time to be determined by the IHA Board.

END OF YEAR (EOY) QUALIFICATIONS

OVERALL HIGH POINT AWARDS (HPAs)

IHA will be offering an overall End of Day and End of Year Grand and Reserve High Point Awards. In-Hand, Showmanship and Reining will not count towards HPAs. **NEW FOR 2020**: Overall High Point Grand & Reserve will be awarded to the exhibitors with the highest cumulative points in both Walk/Jog & Intro Ranch. In-Hand trail and Showmanship not to count towards HPA's

END OF YEAR AWARDS (EOY'S)

- 1. You must be a member in good standing with Islip Horsemen's Association and have current membership status for your points to be counted towards End of Year awards and placings.
- 2. To qualify for EOY awards, you must have shown 2 out of 3 shows. Reiners must score in 2 out of 3 shows to qualify. For Division EOY, you must show 2 of 3 shows, with a minimum of 3 division classes per show.
- 3. In the event of an injury to your horse mid-season, a veterinary note will be required if there is a substituted horse; back number will remain the same.

EOY DIVISION AWARDS will be based on the highest cumulative point standings at the end of the season division class (Showmanship, Trail, Horsemanship, and Pleasure for each division). **You must show in a minimum of 3 division classes, at two (2) of the three (3) shows**

 $EOY\,CLASS\,AWARDS$ will be presented to the overall Grand and Reserve Champions in Halter, Colorbreed Halter, Ranch Halter, In-Hand Trail, and Reining, with ribbons to $6^{\rm th}$ place



WESTERN DIVISION DESCRIPTIONS

Leadline

Open to riders eight (8) years old and under. Leadline riders may show in this division only and must show both classes in two (2) of the three (3) shows in order to be eligible for end-of-year award. Side walkers shall be allowed in all Leadline classes.

Buckaroo

Open to riders who have advanced out of leadline and are under the age of 12. Classes are walk/jog only. Exhibitors may ride two-handed regardless of the type of bit being used. Riders are excluded from riding in any other division (including Ranch), but may show in halter and in-hand classes.

Full Pint

Open to all riders (excluding trainers) 50 years of age and over who have not ridden in any discipline which requires rider to lope in a group or any individual or group class/event where they are required to lope/canter/jump/run. Classes are walk/jog only. Exhibitors may ride two-handed regardless of the type of bit being used. Exhibitors are excluded from riding in any other division (including ranch), but may show in halter and open in-hand classes.

Walk /Jog (Youth & Adult combined)

Open to riders who have not ridden in any discipine (with the exception of any beginner division or under, and adult riders who have not shown in the past ten [10] years) which requires riders to lope in a group. In Walk/Jog, riders must ride one-handed with an approved AQHA shank bit. Classes may be split into Youth and Adult provided there are three (3) or more riders in EACH age group. Riders may ride in the Walk/Jog division for a maximum of three (3) years. Riders who have earned a Champion or Reserve Champion EOY award twice will advance after two years. Walk/Jog riders may also enter in-hand classes and cross-enter into Intro to Ranch.

Beginner (Youth & Adult combined)

Walk/Jog/Lope division open to riders who have advanced out of the Walk/Jog Division, or who are cross-entering from any other discipline with no restrictions on previous wins. Trainers are not eligible for this division, regardless of discipline. Horses in this division are to be ridden in an AQHA-approved shank bit and must be ridden one-handed. Class may be split into Youth and Adult provided there are three (3) or more riders in EACH age group. Riders in this division may cross-enter the All Age division. Riders may ride in this division for a maximum of three (3) years. Riders who have earned a Champion or Reserve EOY award for two consecutive years will advance to the OPEN division.

Open

Open to any rider (including trainers) who does not meet the qualifications for any other divisions. Riders in this division may not revert to a lower division.

All Age

Open to all riders (except those in the Walk/Jog and Intro to Ranch division), including trainers. Beginner riders should take into consideration their ability to control and navigate their horse in a large group class.

Ranch Division Descriptions

****The Ranch division will be split into three (3) subdivisions: Intro (Walk/Jog only), Beginner (Walk/Jog/Lope) and Open (Walk/Jog/Lope). Riders must show in two (2) of the three (3) riding classes and two (2) out of three (3) shows in order to qualify for EOY division awards. Walk/Jog exhibitors (with the eception of Full Pint Exhibitors) may cross enter into the Intro to Ranch Division****

Intro Ranch

Open to riders who have never ridden in any discipline which requires riders to lope in a group or any individual or group class/event where they are required to lope/canter/jump/run. In Walk/Jog, riders must ride one-handed with an approved AQHA shank bit. Riders may ride in the Walk/Jog division for a maximum of three (3) years. Riders who have earned a Champion or Reserve Champion EOY award twice will advance after two years. Walk/Jog riders may also enter in-hand classes.

Beginner Ranch

Walk/Jog/Lope division open to riders who have advanced out of the Walk/Jog Division, or who are cross-entering from any other discipline with no restrictions on previous wins. Trainers are not eligible for this division, regardless of discipline. Horses in this division are to be ridden in an AQHA-approved shank bit and must be ridden one-handed. Class may be split into Youth and Adult provided there are three (3) or more riders in EACH age group. Riders in this division may cross-enter into the All Age division. Riders may ride in this division for a maximum of three (3) years. Riders who have earned a Champion or Reserve EOY award for two consecutive years will advance to the OPEN division.

Open Ranch

Open to any rider (including trainers) who does not meet the qualifications for any other divisions. Riders in this division may not revert to a lower division.

If an exhibitor cross-enters and shows in the Beginner, Open or All Age Division requiring loping in a group, they <u>CANNOT</u> show in Intro (W/J) Ranch classes

Exhibitors entering the Ranch division (except for Intro) may only cross-enter into the All Age division Good Luck to all Riders Showing in 2020

WESTERN CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Halter/Colorbreed Halter

Horses to be shown in hand are judged on overall confirmation, balance and soundness. Exhibitors will be asked to walk & jog their horses at the direction of the judge and to line up head to tail and stand for inspection. Colorbreed halter is restricted to horses of color organizations (Paint, Pinto, Palomino, Appaloosa, Roan, Buckskin, etc.).

Showmanship at Halter

Horses to be shown in hand with emphasis on exhibitor's ability to groom a horse to show at halter and follow a pattern. Exhibitors will be judged on their ability to execute maneuvers described in a pattern.

In-Hand Trail

Horses to be judged over a series of obstacles at the walk and jog, including but not limited to: Ground tying, side-passing, backing, bridges, walking/ jogging over ground poles or obstacles you would see in an under-saddle trail class. A horse can be shown in a leather, nylon, or rope halter with a standard-length lead. No training aids, such as crops or carrot sticks, may be used. Proper western attire is required.

Leadline

To be judged at the walk and jog, on horsemanship and suitability. Will be asked to perform a simple pattern in the pattern class.

Horsemanship

Exhibitors are judged on their ability to execute a prescribed pattern, performing each maneuver as smoothly as possible, while keeping a balanced body position. Exhibitors will be asked to walk/jog/lope as a group at least one direction of the arena.

Western Pleasure

Judged on performance, manners, condition, and conformation as a pleasure mount. Horses will be judged at the walk, jog and lope on a reasonably loose rein. Horses will be asked to back up either on the rail or in the lineup. Exception: Walk/jog exhibitors shall show on the rail at the walk and jog only; Walk/ Jog/Individual Lope exhibitors will show on the rail, and lope individually at the discretion of the judge or the steward.

EXTENSION of all Gaits may be asked for at the discretion of the judge

Trail


Exhibitors will be asked to maneuver their horses over a series of natural obstacles at the walk, jog and lope. Obstacles may include those described in the In-Hand Trail. PLEASE NOTE: IF AN EXHIBITOR IS ENTERED IN REGULAR TRAIL AND THE RANCH DIVISION/CLASSES, YOU MUST COMPLETE YOUR REGULAR TRAIL CLASS PRIOR TO THE RANCH DIVISION/CLASSES

Amateur Reining

Open to amateur riders. No restrictions.

Open Reining

Open to all riders, including trainers.



RANCH HORSE CLASSES

Equipment and Attire

Horses shall be shown in a western stock saddle. Silver equipment is discouraged but will not count over good, clean, working equipment. Horses of all ages may be shown in AQHA-approved snaffle, bosal or curb bit. Split reins or romal reins shall be used with all curb bits. Split reins may be used with snaffle bits. Curb straps or curb chains are required for curb bits, must measure at least ½ inch in width and must lie flat against the horse's chin; no wire curbs are permitted regardless of the amount of padding or tape.

<u>Prohibited Equipment</u>: Tiedowns, cavessons, gag bits, twisted-wire mouth pieces, side-pulls, mechanical hackamores, running martingales, and protective legware (leg wraps, splint boots, bell boots, etc.) are prohibited.

Neat, clean western hat (or helmet for exhibitors under 18 years of age), western long-sleeved button-down or snapped shirts, jeans and Western boots, including lace-up ropers, shall be worn. All other footwear is prohibited. Protective head gear or Western hats shall also be worn. The use of spurs and chinks/chaps shall be optional.

Ranch Halter

To be shown in a leather halter and a lead with or without a chain. SILVER SHOW HALTERS are discouraged. All entries will be judged at a walk, trot and extended trot. Entries will line up at the judge's direction. To be judged 60% on correctness, balance and conformation suitable for a working ranch-type horse and 40% on manners and disposition.

Ranch Rail Pleasure


The Ranch Horse Rail Pleasure Class measures the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride, while being used as a means of conveyance from one ranch task to another. The horse should be well-broke, relaxed, quiet, soft, and cadenced at all gaits. Ridden on a relatively loose rein with light contact and without requiring undue restraint. Horse should be responsive to rider & make timely transitions smoothly and correctly; should be soft in the bridle and yield to rider contact. The ideal stock horse should have a natural, level-headed carriage at each gait. Gaits may include ordinary walk, extended walk, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope and stop (from the trot and/or lope or both). When asked for an extended gait, the ranch horse shall show a lengthening of stride with the same cadence that will cause an increase in speed. All horses will be asked to be backed separately.

Ranch Riding

The purpose of the Ranch Riding class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from preforming one ranch task to the next. The horse should reflect versatility, attitude, and movement of a working ranch horse outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, relaxed, quiet, soft, and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse is to be ridden with light contact, or on a relatively loose rein, without requiring undue restraint, but not a full drape of reins. Overall manners and responsiveness of the ranch riding horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as the quality of the movement are primary. Horse should have a natural head carriage at each gait.

Ranch Trail

The Ranch Trail Class, as the name implies, tests the horse's ability to cope with situations encountered in everyday riding. The horse is ridden through a pattern of obstacles which should nearly approximate those found during the course of everyday work. The horse/rider team is judged on the correctness, efficiency and pattern accuracy with which the obstacles are negotiated, and the attitude and mannerisms exhibited by the horse. Judging emphasis is on identifying the well-broke, responsive, well-mannered horse which can correctly navigate and negotiate the course. Obstacles may include but not be limited to walk-, trot- or lope-overs; opening, passing through and closing gate; ride over wooden bridge; backing and side-pass obstacles; step in and out of obstacles, etc. Obstacles should not be of the type to trap the horse/ rider team or eliminate it by making it too difficult.

2020 RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION

- In order to comply with IHA rules, age status is determined as of December 1st of the previous year. Youth riders are 17 years of age or under; Adult riders are 18 years of age and over as of December 1st.
- 2. The Islip Horsemen's Association encourages qualified persons with disabilities to participate in its programs and activities. *If you anticipate needing any type of reasonable accommodation or have questions about the physical access provided, please contact Annmarie McAuley at 516-319-0761 in advance of your participation or visit.*
- 3. Riders will be notified of their advancement to a higher division. A rider may voluntarily advance to a higher division; however, they may not return to a lower division at any time in the future. All classes being offered will be conducted and run in accordance with the IHA Rules and Regulations, and the 2019 AQHA Rule Book unless otherwise specified. IHA rules supersede any other rules. Should a question or dispute arise that is not covered in the rulebook, the judges' and show management decisions will be final. A protest, in writing, must be lodged the day of the event to the show manager or committee chairperson. All decisions by said person will be final and protests will be answered in writing if necessary.
- 4. Pre-entries will be accepted online at *Horseshowing.com*, by phone or e-mail until 9:00 PM the Thursday before the show. All other forms of entry, such as mail, are the responsibility of the entrant and must be received by the Thursday deadline. When a horse show extends the courtesy of taking an advanced entry(ies) over the phone, it is with the understanding that said entry(ies) will be paid and credit is extended on these terms. No exhibitor will be permitted to perform without payment of fees. A \$25 handling fee will be assessed for any returned checks. *All checks are made payable to Islip Horseman's Association, Inc.* A signature for all riders, including those of the guardian of junior exhibitors, will be required.
- 5. All pre-entry and entry forms must be completed in their entirety. Any entry form which is NOT complete, will be rejected, and full entry fees may be due if not submitted prior to 9:00pm, the Thursday prior to the show
- 6. No refunds will be issued unless a licensed veterinarian's diagnosis of the horse's unsoundness, or a Doctor's note of the rider's inability to perform are submitted. If your horse is unable to perform and there is a valid veterinary note, you will be allowed the use of another horse under the same number and will be eligible for EOY awards. You may revert to your original horse if he becomes fit or continue with the second horse, but there may be no other changes. There will be no refunds offered beyond ten days of the show date. NOTE: There may be no substitutions in Halter.
- 7. All participants and spectators enter premises and ride at their own risk. IHA and Suffolk County Department of Parks disclaim any liability for any accident or occurrence no matter what the cause.

- 8. Absolutely no stallions will be permitted in competition within the IHA at any time. In addition, due to the dangerous nature of stallions in close proximity to other horses, they are not permitted on the show grounds or area while the IHA is ompeting
- 9. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide any class. Classes with less than three riders may be combined. Classes with less than three (3) riders may be held, but no points will be awarded for that class. If cancelled, money will be refunded. All class entries will be closed when the preceding class enters the show ring. A two-minute rule to enter the ring will be strictly enforced. ***<u>It is the rider's responsibility to</u> <u>be ready for their class</u>***
- 10. Correct mandatory western attire is required: long-sleeved western shirt, hat, boots, chaps are recommended, but not required. Riders under the age of 18 must wear an ASTM approved safety helmet at all times when mounted (NYS law).
- 11. Proper tack is mandatory. Horses 5 years old and younger may be shown in an AQHA approved snaffle bit, curb (shank) bit, or bosal. Horses 6 years old and older may only be shown in an AQHA approved curb (shank) bit. When a curb bit is used, a curb strap, or curb chain is required, but must meet the approval of the judge, be at least one-half (1/2") inch in width and lie flat against the jaw of the horse. Curb chains cannot be tied to the bit with string or cord. A broken strap or chain is not necessarily cause for disqualification. <u>Riders must ride one-handed with any kind of shank/curb bit.</u>
- 12. First through sixth place ribbons will be awarded in each class and points awarded per the following point schedule:




