

### Board Meeting Highlights

The HOA has been busy this year with meetings almost every month. A good portion of the meeting time is still taken up with covenant violations. Please remember, you must get Architectural Control Board (ACB) approval before making any changes to the outside of your home, cutting down a tree, or constructing any structure on your property — even mailboxes. The covenants are listed on the website (Ilphoa.org). If you download the covenants to your computer, the document will be searchable (Alt+F), making it easy to find a particular word. It was decided that ACB approval will be good for only 6 months and then a new request must be submitted.

One of my duties is to check the HOA online mailbox. I try to check it at least once a day. I have coined a new idiom, along the lines of "A watched pot never boils." Mine is "A watched mailbox will receive no mail." I can check everyday and find nothing; but if I forget, sure enough, mail with flow in. In fact, the number of emails received seems to be directly related to the number of days I have not checked. Please be patient when submitting a request. Remember, we are all volunteers and have many other responsibilities.

The meetings usually last 1 to 1-1/2 hours. At every meeting, we read the minutes from the previous meeting and the treasure presents her monthly report(s). We then hear from all the committees and attend to old and new business. We ask for community member comments if anyone is in attendance. We welcome community participation and input. Feel free to attend.

Good news: Our total membership is now at 125, which is great because that is the number of members our budget is based on. Bad news: That means nearly 80 residents have not joined the HOA. Imagine the improvements we could make with \$8000.

## IT'S THAT TIME OF THE YEAR...

Yes, I'm talking about Hurricane Season. Officially, Hurricane Season runs from June 1st to November 30th. Due to warm sea surface temperatures in the Atlantic and the La Nina effect, an active season is predicted. Twelve facilities have already issued their predictions with NOAA announcing their predictions on Thursday, May 23rd.

Most of us are veterans when it comes to hurricane preparedness, but for the newbies, here is some sage advice. Long Leaf has underground utilities, but unfortunately the power lines leading to our neighborhood are above ground. So, it's a good idea to prepare for a power outage. Remember, the best time to prepare is BEFORE the season begins.

- 1. Put together an <u>"emergency kit"</u> to get you through the entire season. It should include: a battery-powered radio and extra batteries (better yet, a portable crank or solar-powered radio with USB charger for your cell phones), flashlight, manual can opener, and a loud whistle in case you need to summon help.
- 2. Water (1 gallon per person).
- 3. Canned and nonperishable food for you and your pets — enough for days. Keep in a cool dry place.
- 4. Filling a bathtub with water for washing and flushing is still a good idea.
- 5. Make sure you have all your medications on hand.
- 6. Put important documents, such as your homeowner's insurance policy, in a waterproof container or bag. Have electronic copies on your computer, if possible.
- 7. Inventory your home and take pictures to document damage.
- Emergency contact information and CASH.



After the storm, stay off the roads as much as possible until they have been cleared. Try not to drive through puddles as you can't be certain how deep the water is or what might be hidden in them. Due to the rolling nature of our neighborhood, we have sustained very little flooding in past storms. We have lost some trees. A good way to minimize tree damage is to have your trees trimmed/ thinned prior to a storm. We have many tree trimmers in the area. Give one a call.
