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
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
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
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Fall Edition Board Meeting Highlights

Our annual meeting is coming up on November 3 2022 at 7:30 p.m. Refreshments will be provided from 7:00 - 7:30 PM. We hope to see you there. We are currently seeking volunteers to fill vacant positions on our board. Unfortunately, due to family commitments, I have not sought re-election to serve on the board or as your chairman for the next term, but will continue to assist the board as needed or appointed. It has been a pleasure serving this community as your chairman for the last two years, and it has been very nice getting to know many of you in the process.

I am very proud of the advances we have made over the past few years. The implementation of our website, including online payments for membership, and overall increased communication with our membership, the establishment of a tree fund, and maintaining our median and community standard as we always have are just a few highlights. However, there is still much work to be done. In my view, we have not done enough to maintain our dying tree canopy, which sets our community aside from everywhere else. If anyone needs a visual of what our community will look like with a bland, treeless landscape, simply take a drive to Victoria Oaks nearby. It is perfect image of what we chose not to be a part of when we purchased our homes in this community – more and more houses built without consideration for much of anything. This is not what we are or what was envisioned when this community was planned. We have lost good, thoughtful board members as a result of our inability to take necessary steps related to our trees, and this needs to change.

President John F. Kennedy said related to the moon mission:

We choose to go to the moon... and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard, because that goal will serve to organize and measure the best of our energies and skills, because that challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one which we intend to win...

It is easy to drop a tree, cut it up, and have it hauled away, all while chipping away at the very thing that makes us stand out from the rest of the communities in this county and state. It is much harder to collectively plan to plant new trees to preserve this community for future generations. I would implore our community to do what is hard, because it is worth it. I would likewise implore future members of our board to consider changing the standard for tree removals to a "tree out, tree back in" policy as a condition for approval for all tree removals. This, in my view, would not require a covenant change; only a change in how tree removals are approved. This is the only way that we will be able to preserve and maintain our canopy for years to

October was a busy month for Long Leaf.

We had a Board meeting on October 18th to finalize last minute preparations for Oktoberfest. The board worked very hard to ensure there was something for everyone to enjoy. REAL ESTATE (GOOD) NEWS

For many of us, our home is our biggest asset. Despite many dire predictions regarding the real estate market, it is still a sound investment and faring better than most other forms of investment. Here is what has been happening in the neighborhood these past 2 years:



In 2021, 10 houses were Sold in Long Leaf. There have 4 sales so far this year (2022) with 1 Active listing and 1 Pending listing.

I am happy to report, prices have continued to increase this year compared to last year. On average, houses are selling for 98% of asking price and the average price per square foot for a pool home has increased from approximately \$179 per square foot (2021) to \$218 per square foot (2022). No home has sold this year that did not have a pool.

As you all know, our neighborhood is unique with the beautiful tree canopy and large lots. The new communities are clear cut of all trees, and many homes are being built on 40′ wide lots.

Let's continue to give our neighborhood the love and respect it deserves. Join the Board, plant a tree, or volunteer for a committee. We need you.



NADA'S FAMOUS OATMEAL CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

 $1\,\%$ cups of all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon of baking soda

1 teaspoon of baking powder

1 teaspoon of salt

1 cup of vegetable shortening

1 cup of granulated sugar

1 cup of light-brown sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

2 cups of old-fashioned oats

2 cups of Rice Krispies cereal

1 cup of sweetened flake coconut

1 bag (6 ounces) of semisweet chocolate chips (I use 12 oz)

- 1. Heat oven to 350 deg F. Place parchment paper on baking sheets and set aside.
- In large bowl, beat shortening and both sugars on medium-high speed about 3 minutes or until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in vanilla.
- 3. On low speed, gradually add flour mixture and beat until just combined. Stir in oats, Rice Krispies, coconut and chocolate chips.
- 4. Form balls with 1 tablespoon of dough and place 2 inches apart on prepared sheets. Bake at 350 for 15-20 min or until golden color on the edges of cookies. Cool on sheets for 5 minutes then transfer to cooling rack to cool completely.
- Once cookies have cooled, place them in a closed container with a cut up piece of white/wheat bread to keep cookies fresh. Remove bread after 3-4 hours, otherwise cookies become too hard/dry
