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Letter from the Chairman

In the past two months 8 houses have sold in Long Leaf Plantation. This speaks volumes for our beautiful 30+ year old neighborhood and the fact that it is still in high demand. We would like to think this is due to the positive impact Long Leaf has on visitors and potential homebuyers. So many of you do your part by maintaining a beautiful homestead - thank you.

At the same time, the ACB and the Board work diligently to ensure the neighborhood remains desirable. At times it may seem as though these two entities are a thorn in your side; however, without them, we would look like our neighbors to the south of us with a few well maintained homes and yet a larger portion that are unkempt. To maintain a desirable neighborhood, it takes homeowner involvement, a dedicated team of residents and money. Long Leaf has been operating for the past ten years on a membership dues structure of \$75.00 a year, per home, while costs have continued to rise but membership hasn't. So that Long Leaf will be able to meet its needs, it will be necessary to enact a dues increase effective with next year's dues, beginning January 1. We anticipate a \$25 a year increase to \$100 annually per home. Today we are at an association membership rate of approximately 70%. This volume barely keeps us solvent; especially in the event of a major unexpected expense. Please do your part and join your association today.

As happens every few years, the Covenants are reviewed for possible update and improvement toward building a stronger community that works for the protection of all residents. The Board of Directors, along with a small group of advisors, are reviewing and revising the Covenants. Over the next few months, you will receive a copy of the revisions with a request for your additional input. We will keep you updated as this process progresses.

Meanwhile, your Board is focusing on tasks such as finding ways to have walking paths installed along Stratford, and saving expenses through the possibility of bringing a recycled water line to the irrigation system along the median. It is more and more important for residents to get involved in their neighborhood. If you can't give of your time, then become an association member if you are not one already. Join us today by contacting any one of your Board members.

Know the BUZZ About Mosquito Control



The Zika Virus is still with us. Mosquito larvae develop in standing water. Check your home to rid it of standing water. Elimination of breeding sites is one of the keys to prevention.

- **DISCARD** old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots, pans, and broken appliances.
- TURN OVER or remove empty pots and buckets.
- PICK UP beverage containers and cups.
- CLEAN OUT eaves, troughs and gutters.
- REPLACE water in birdbaths and pet feeding dishes at least once a week.
- **DRAIN** water from boats and tarps.
- MAINTAIN the chemistry of swimming pools. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.
- COVER windows and doors with screens.

It's also a time when we start to water our lawns more frequently due to the growing season and the warmer temps. Hopefully you are all adhering to the Volusia County Watering Restrictions outlined on the bottom back page of this newsletter. Many of us have automatic watering systems that are extremely helpful in keeping us to this schedule. Unfortunately, we also by-pass it when it has been raining. This has a double negative to it since we are spending money for watering we don't need and we are also over watering our grass, creating shallow roots. If possible, please try to be more aware of when your sprinklers are needed and when they are not. Your lawn will love you for it.

Unwanted Solicitors

As you enter into our community you will see signs located at the end of each median that states "NO Soliciting." This is done as a protection for the residents to eliminate unwanted persons from wandering the neighborhood. Recently, we have had a number of solicitors who have been asked to leave, but are very persistent. "To Die For" Blueberry Muffins

Ingredients:

1½ Cup All-Purpose Flour ¾ Cup White Sugar ½ tsp Salt 2 tsp Baking Powder ⅓ Cup Vegetable Oil 1 Egg ⅓ Cup Milk 1 Cup Fresh Blueberries

Topping:

½ Cup White Sugar ⅓ Cup All-Pourpose Flour ⅙ Cup Butter, cubed 1½ tsp Ground Cinnamon

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400°. Grease muffin cups or line with muffin liners.

Combine flour, sugar, salt, & baking powder. Place the vegetable oil into a 1 cup measuring cup, then add the egg & enough milk to fill the cup.

Mix this with flour mixture. Fold in blueberries. Fill muffin cups right to the top, and sprinkle with crumb topping mixture.

To make Crumb Topping, mix together sugar, flour, butter & Cinnamon. Mix with a fork, & sprinkle over muffins before baking.

Bake for 20 – 25 minutes in the preheated oven, or until done.
