
# **Annual Meeting**

### **Orange Raisin Cake**

A Nebraska Original Recipe, Serves 14-16

This recipe is courtesy of our neighbor Jan Seltman

#### **Ingredients:**

1 Medium orange, including the rind 1½ c. Raisins 1 cup Nuts 2 c. Flour 1 tsp baking soda ½ tsp salt 1 c. Buttermilk 1 c. powdered sugar water

½ c. Oil 1 c. Sugar 2 Eggs

#### **Directions:**

Grind orange, raisins and nuts together. Set aside ¼ cup for glaze. Blend oil and sugar. Mix in eggs one at a time with flour, baking soda, salt, buttermilk and larger portion of the mixture. Bake in 13 x 9-inch lightly greased and floured pan for 30 minutes at 350 degrees. Let cool.

Glaze: Add powdered sugar to the reserved mixture and add enough water to make it spreadable. Spread or drizzle over cake.

This past month, several cases of the Zika virus have been found in northern Miami, and the first recorded death from the virus was found in Texas. While we do not wish to cause a panic of any sort, we do want to see our neighborhood using better mosquito control. Mosquitos breed in standing water, so please take the time to walk around your lot to make sure all potential areas for standing water are eliminated. These would include old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots, pans, boat tarps, long standing water in bird baths, unfiltered swimming pools, and broken appliances. Turn over any item that is holding water for more than a day at a time, and always wear mosquito repellant with a high level of DEET (25% or greater) whenever outside where mosquitos may be present. Please protect yourself and your neighborhood.

## **Getting to Know your Neighbors**

We asked Nada Acquaro to provide us with a little background on herself and consent to being our 'Neighbor' for this quarter's issue of The Sentinel. We were so inspired by her story that it was decided to reprint her submission as it was presented...

Some of our newcomers in Longleaf may know me from visiting you with Ron Derstine when you first moved into your home.

*I was raised in Europe and came to the U.S.* in 1975 at the age of 16. Grew up in Bosnia, Croatia and from age 10-16 y/o in Vienna, Austria. My family emigrated to the U.S. as political immigrants. We were so very blessed to have the opportunity to come to this wonderful country. Freedom of speech has a special meaning when you come from a communist State. Since immigration seems to be in the news lately I want to take a few minutes to explain what it took for us to come to the U.S. First, we had to have a sponsor. My father had a friend he grew up with in Bosnia who lived in St. Louis MO. The sponsor helps immigrants find shelter, work, and supports them while they acclimate to their new home country. My family applied for political asylum to the U.S. while we lived in Vienna. We had to complete many pages of forms through the American Embassy. We then had to have two separate interviews as a family at the American Embassy. The whole process took eleven months. You may think that just about anybody could claim to be persecuted in their own country and come to the U.S. right? Not quite as easy. My father spent nine years as a political prisoner of the communist state in the former Yugoslavia and had the paperwork to prove why he was imprisoned. This justification was what allowed us to come to the U.S. A cousin of ours applied at the same time and he was not approved as he just wanted a better life (economic immigrant). Some may ask why we didn't just stay in Austria? We enjoyed living in Austria, however, Austria is politically neutral country and will give up any non-citizen without question to their former country if requested.

My father was deported twice from Vienna back
to Yugoslavia at the request of the Yugoslavian
Communist State. The fear of being sent back
a third time is what prompted my parents to
request political asylum in the U.S. I am grateful
to be here and I'm very proud to be an American
Citizen.

*My parents, my brother and I started our new* life in St. Louis MO where I finished High School. I then joined the Military and completed four years in the U.S. Army. I very much enjoyed my military experience. I had the opportunity to be stationed in Frankfurt, Germany where I met my wonderful husband, Tom, who was stationed there as an Army officer. After leaving the Military I went back to St. Louis and enrolled into College. I completed a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing and an MBA to follow. Tom and I were married after my first year of college. I went back into the military as a Reserve Air Force Officer after completing my education. Our civilian jobs took us to Massachusetts for 14 yrs and then to South Florida for 7 yrs. We moved to our beautiful Long Leaf neighborhood in 2008. I retired from the Air Guard in 2012 and am content to just have one job now. Tom worked for municipalities as a Human Resource Director for many years and retired a couple of years ago. You may notice the lawn is a little greener since he retired and our two cats are a lot happier with Tom at home. I worked as a nurse in various hospitals for 25 yrs and now I work with our veterans. I work in a VA doctor's office in Orange City. Any veterans in our neighborhood eligible for VA Health Care please come and visit our clinic.

Along with Ron I welcome new residents to our neighborhood. I also send the annual membership dues and an updated directory when you join the Association. Please let me know if I missed sending you a directory. I apologize in advance. My phone number is: 954-681-1313.
