

ECUADOR INFORMATION & PACKING LIST

VOLTAGE: 120 V, 60 Hz (same as in the USA)

CURRENCY: US Dollar

- Large bills up to 50s are recommended for large expenses. Small bills, 20s and under for shopping and small expenses.
- Credit cards are accepted in some places and it is best to have one for emergencies.

Traveler's checks are also a secure way to carry money for emergencies. These can only be exchanged at main banks or specific locations, resulting in a very long time consuming process, therefore we do not recommend their use for shopping and use of services.

CLOTHES AND ACCESORIES:

Andean temperatures range from 70 F to 40 F every day, therefore we recommend layers of clothing to make your day comfortable.

You might need just a t-shirt until midday and a fleece or jacket in the afternoon and at sunset.

- Long pants or jeans (shorts are not recommended unless you are going to Galapagos or the rain forest)
- Fleece jacket, scarf (rain jacket or rain poncho only if traveling between December and May)
- T-shirts (we highly recommend long-sleeves for sun protection)
- Light sweater, remember that you will visit the Otavalo Market known for its wool and alpaca sweaters, colorful slacks, scarves, bags, ponchos, etc.
- Comfortable walking shoes (timberlands or similar), flip-flops are not recommended unless you are going to Galapagos or the coast
- Sunglasses (very important)
- Hat (wide brim recommended)
- Camera gear (cables, memory cards, battery charger)
- Flashlight
- Hair dryer
- Reusable Water Bottle
- Bathing suit for Hot tub











TOILETRIES/ MEDICINE: Sunblock (VERY important, remember you will be exposed to strong equatorial sun), Advil, Pepto-Bismol, toothpaste, contact lens solutions, eye drops, lip sun protector, body and face moisturizing lotion. Bring enough prescription medication.

RECOMENDED: Travel and health insurance.

COMUNICATIONS: Some mobile phones work in Ecuador, depending on yourcarrier and location. Find out about rates with your carrier. We have Wi-Fi in the hotelreading room and bar area. Nearby towns also have Internet cafes with descent Internet speed at very inexpensive rates.
