There are new rules for large furniture & bulky item collection

Booking requests must be completed at least 5 business days in advance, online at service.london.ca or by phone at 519-661-2489. Collection will occur on your next scheduled garbage day. Large items are over 1 metre wide, 1.5 metres tall and require 2 or more people to safely place at the curb. There is a four item limit per collection. Visit london.ca/garbage for booking requests

Here's a great Autumn recipe that uses all in-season ingredients from your own garden!

1 Butternut Squash

3 cups fresh green beans cut into 3rds

3 cups hominy (white or yellow)

Chicken stock, enough cover ingredients.

Bouquet garni (rosemary, parsley, sage, bay leaf)

2tbsp of butter

2tbsp flour

3/4 cup milk

Remember while preparing your 3 sisters soup it is important to have a clear mind. Good thoughts and intentions, healing vibes, should all be part of your preparation and cooking. This is native medicine after all!

Add your prepared squash beans as corn to a soup pot

Add chicken stock. Enough to cover

Tie your fresh herb bundle and add to soup mix

Cover and being everything to a gentle boil over medium high heat

Lower to simmer and cover for 35 mins

In small bowl whisk together butter flour and milk until there are no lumps

Stir flour mix slowly into soup. Bring back to gentle boil for 5 mins.

Tie your fresh herb bundle and add to soup mix

Serve with fresh frybread or Bannock

The term "3 sisters" refers to the three main crops of some northern indigenous people. Maize squash and beans. The 3 were painted close together like close sisters and aided each other in growing.

NDN TACOS

Owen and Joni Edwards operate NDN Tacos an Indigenous food stand and catering business offering frybread tacos, corn soup, fresh caught Pickeral, fries and more!

A lifelong love of food and cooking was the inspiration to start NDN Tacos in 2019.

All menu items are homemade with recipes passed down from family members. We offer fusion and original style food creations, but our roots lay in traditional foods. As much as possible we use, organic, homegrown foods.

Joni, head chef, is Ojibwe from Kettle Point Ontario. While not formally taught, was taught with hands on teachings from strong women in the Milliken family.

Owen, baker and sous chef, while not indigenous by birth, having been together for 20 years, he is native by heart. Often sharing his own teachings he's learned along the way. * The NDN Tacos cookbook will be ready for Christmas 2024! *

WAR MEMORIAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL & HILDA STUART

Hilda Stuart trained at VH, went to war, and was then superintendent of nursing at Victoria Hospital for 17 years from 1931 to 1948.

Vision SoHo is an alliance formed between six non-profit housing developers to collectively and expediently address London's housing crisis by creating beautifully designed, environmentally friendly, and well-managed buildings. These developments will range in affordability—some being market rate and others at affordable and deeply affordable rates—and will offer a variety of unit types catering to single individuals, couples as well as families. Over 680 units will be created in total. The focus area for the development is the Old Victoria Hospital Lands. The Vision SoHo Alliance closed on the land in the fall 2022 and began construction in 2023.

Indwell is a founding member of the Vision SoHo Alliance. Indwell will create and operate 138 units of deeply affordable housing with supports in two heritage buildings.



Indwell is eager to take on restoring the two heritage buildings on the site: the Health Services Building and the War Memorial Children's Hospital. They are beautiful buildings with important and rich ties to our city's history. The two buildings will be retrofitted to create 138 new apartments, 96 at the Health Services Building and 42 at the Children's Hospital. The Health Services Building will include a community space in the Auditorium offering food security and other amenities to the entire development and SoHo neighbourhood.

In 2023, Indwell celebrated reaching their goal of \$3 million from the community for the War Memorial Children's Hospital. Remediation work is complete, and construction begins this summer. The building will open in 2026.

Special Hours ONLY open to University or College students needing assistance 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM - Saturday (closed certain Saturdays in July, August, and December). Please note that you MUST be a student in order to use Saturday hours; however, students may also come any time we are open during the week. There is one school in SoHo: Aberdeen Public School. Students may also attend Holy Cross and Holy Rosary Catholic schools, and Tecumseh Public School. High school-aged students attend Catholic Central, London South, H.B. Beal, or Central secondary schools.

The Safer School Buses Act mandates that all school buses manufactured after 2005 have the amber-red light warning system.

Amber flashing lights warn motorists that a school bus is about to stop for students. Motorists can still safely pass the bus while the amber lights are on. Once the bus is at a full and complete stop, the red flashing lights will appear and a stop arm will be activated.

Once the red lights stop flashing and the stop arm closes, the school bus will begin to move and drivers may proceed.

Not stopping for a school bus is extremely dangerous and carries a hefty fine. For more information:

ABERDEEN PUBLIC SCHOOL

The original school was built in 1883 facing Hamilton Road. Aberdeen is located on the corner of Adelaide Road and Hamilton Road and is part of the Beal Family of Schools. Our school has a population of approximately 220 students from Junior Kindergarten to grade eight. Together, the Aberdeen staff and community strive to help all students reach their full potential. We have a rich history, and we believe in respect for everyone. We are a caring, learning community. After Lord Aberdeen,



Governor General of Canada, visited London in 1893, the Board of Education decided to name the school in his honour. The present building with the entrance on Grey Street was opening in 1914. It looks very similar today. Miss J.P. Fairburn, who began teaching at Aberdeen when it first opened in 1883 was still there in 1926. This is the longest record of any one teacher remaining at Aberdeen! C.C. Carrothers, once a student at Aberdeen, went on to be a trustee with the board in the 1930's. An elementary school was named in his honour. Today Aberdeen consists of 12 classrooms which spans from Full Day Kindergarten to Grade 8. Core French and Oneida as a Second Language is part of the daily programming for students in grades 4 thru 8.

- Place Yard Waste at the curb by 7 a.m. on the first day of your scheduled week, but no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before. Crews will only collect from each street or complex once during the week.
- · Includes: Christmas trees, brush, and pumpkins, or leaves in paper bags, plastic or metal cans between 30 L – 125 L or certified compostable bags with logos:



- · Brush must be less than 10 cm in diameter and cut into 1 m lengths. Tie in bundles with twine.
- · Maximum weight per container or bundle is 20 kg (44 lbs).
- Container size: 30 L minimum and 125 L maximum.
- No grass clippings







DON'Ts (X)

We do not accept:

- Dirt/soil, rocks, sod
- Large branches, tree stumps
- Grass clippings
- Flower pots/trays Kitchen scraps
- Pet waste Painted or treated wood, railway ties

Inside the Health Services Building at Vision SoHo In June, Indwell opened up the Health Services Building to some of the London Community Foundation team, accompanied by a photographer, to take a first look inside the building before renovations begin. As part of the Vision SoHo Alliance's wider development at the site, the building will include 96 affordable supportive studios, one- and two-bedroom apartments, anchored by a community food hub in the former auditorium.

NATIONAL TREE DAY

The City of London will be giving out 2,000 trees this year as part of National Tree Day 2024. This year's event will take place on September 25, 2024.

The City of London will be giving away 2,000 trees to residents as part of London's annual celebration of National Tree Day on September 25, 2024.

Residents will be able to pick from 12 different types of native trees while supplies last. There is a limit of two trees per vehicle, on a first-come, first-serve basis.

It is important to protect and maintain newly planted trees for the first year after they've been planted. Residents can learn more about caring for new trees at london.ca/trees.
