

FARMERS' MARKET

Over the last two seasons Tappahannock Farmers' Market (TFM) welcomed a significant increase in vendor participation, growing from 60 fulltime vendors in 2020 to 90 in 2021. This year we are on target to host 110 vendors, making our market the largest community farmers' market in the region. Last year we had an estimated monthly visitor attendance of 1,200 per market, and we expect attendance to increase to 1,500 in 2022.

THURSDAYS



In 2021, TMS launched the 3rd Thursdays Art Walk. This was a series of street festivals dedicated to showcasing artists and musicians. We teamed up with the DAW Theater Foundation, Essex County Museum, and Tappahannock Art Guild to bring a unique variety of music to the historic district. Citizens and visitors flooded the street to experience live art demonstrations, a free concert and specialty food and drinks. Our partner organizations, who had seen significant decrease in visitation due to the pandemic, even received some record daily visitation numbers.

ART INITIATIVES

Another important aspect to TMS is beautification efforts. Last year we were able to complete a mural project at the Rappahannock River Park. Artist Bernie Barclay of Love, Create, Art, painted a playful nature themed mural on the sewer pump station. This was also made possible through a generous donation from Sherwin-Williams of Tappahannock who donated all of the paint and supplies.



BUSINESS AFTER HOURS

Last year we launched Business After Hours, an opportunity for our business owners and professionals to meet and network in a casual environment. The first event was hosted by Greg and Jennifer Huff at The Essex Inn and we had 27 attendees. This event will resume on a monthly basis in April 2022 and will be hosted at different locations throughout the year.





ESSEX BUSINESS FORUM



In October we hosted the Essex Business Forum where we welcomed Mike Williams of the Growth Coach to conduct a business strategy and growth workshop. This event was free to all participants and we had a total of 17 local entrepreneurs attend the session. Mr. Williams spoke on best practices for starting and growing and small business. he gave participants the proper tools and training to evaluate their business and identify opportunity for growth and partnership.







TAPPAHANNOCK WINTERFEST

Tappahannock WinterFest kicked-off with the decorating of Prince Street and Tappahannock Central Park. A huge thank you to all of the volunteers and Rappahannock Electric Cooperative for making this winter wonderland come to life! On Small Business Saturday, our Dashing Through Downtown promotion began with a total of 13 businesses participating. Shoppers visited stores to collect stickers to be entered to win multiple gift cards as well as donated door prizes. The 46th annual Christmas Parade on December 5, 2021 was a great success with over 70 units and hundreds of spectators, a Community followed by Tree Lighting ceremony and Merry Marshmallow Roast. The brand new Community Christmas Tree was customized with over 200 ornaments purchased by members of the community. It was truly inspiring to see the community and families come together to enjoy the free event. The following weekend, the WinterFest carnival and market launched with over 50 vendors, iceless iceskating, live performances, games, prizes, bounce houses and more. There was no shortage of smiles or laughter!


