Tip - Read all options before selecting an answer.

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1. Which of the following is **INCORRECT** when teeing off from the teeing area.
 - A. The ball may be teed up or placed between the tee markers, or within one-club length to the outside of either tee marker whichever the player chooses
 - B. When teeing off a hole, the ball must be within a box defined by the outer edges of the tee markers and extending 2 club-lengths back from the front of the markers
 - C. A player may take their stance outside the teeing area as long as the ball is in the teeing area
2. A player hits a ball into an area of high grass, and they are not sure they will be able to find it. In which of the following cases would the player **NOT** receive one or more penalty strokes.
 - A. After hitting the first ball, without saying anything, they tee up and hit another ball. They find their original ball and play it, then pick up the second ball
 - B. After hitting the first ball, without saying anything, they tee up and hit another ball. They cannot find their original ball, so they play the second ball
 - C. After hitting the first ball, the player declares they are playing a provisional ball, then they tee up and hit another ball. They find their original ball and play it then pick up the second ball
3. If you swing at ball intending to hit it but miss it completely, the stroke does not count.
 - A. True

4. Free relief is allowed if your ball is next to tree and the tree interferes with your swing.

5. When must you mark your ball?
 - A. Before lifting it from the putting green
 - B. Before lifting or moving a ball to see if it is yours
 - C. Before picking up it up to see if it is cracked
 - D. All of the above

6. Which of the following options are allowed when taking free relief from temporary water.
- A. Drop a ball from knee height within one club length of the nearest point of complete relief, but not closer to the hole
 - B. Place a ball within one club length of the nearest point of complete relief, not closer to the hole
 - C. Move the ball with your club to a point where you have complete relief
 - D. All of the above
7. Which of the following is **NOT** allowed when taking relief from a penalty area (water hazard).
- A. Drop a ball within 2 club-lengths from the edge laterally from where you estimate the ball landed in the water, but not closer to the hole
 - B. Drop a ball within 2 club-lengths from where you estimate the ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area, but not closer to the hole
 - C. Drop a ball on a line extending from the hole through the point where the ball last crossed into the penalty area, going back as far as you like, but not closer to the hole than the point where the ball crossed into the penalty area.
8. When are you allowed to touch sand in a bunker with your club without penalty?
- A. When addressing the ball in a bunker
 - B. On your backswing when taking a stroke at a ball in a bunker
 - C. Using the club to rake your footprints after hitting the ball out of the bunker
9. In which of the following cases would Player A **NOT** get the general penalty (2 strokes in stroke play)
- A. Player A advises Player B on how the green breaks
 - B. Player A is undecided which club to use so asks Player B which club they used
 - C. Player A asks player B the distance from the tee to the hole
10. You are not entitled to free relief from a fence that marks the boundary of the course.
