



Auxilium Education Coaching presents: Create your own monster

Wednesday, March 25, 2020

This is a lesson my daughter asked me to create, she loves this one!

Supplies - pencil or pen, colored pencils or markers, paper, printing capability for worksheet, scissors, and glue

1. Print out the worksheets below
2. Read the directions on worksheet # 1:
 - a. Please cut these squares out and put them in a bowl or hat
 - b. Once you have done that, mix them around
 - c. Pull a slip out of the bowl to fill in the chart, on worksheet #2. For example, if you select 8 eyes, then your monster will have 8 eyes
 - d. Keep selecting slips of paper until the whole chart on worksheet two is complete
 - e. If you get a repeat for the feature, simply use the first number you selected
3. Then using worksheet #2, based on what you selected, and your chart, create a sketch of your monster.
 - a. This is where the sketch will go
 - b. It is a good time to talk to the kiddos about a sketch
 - i. What is its purpose?
 - ii. Does it have to be perfect?
 - iii. Who will use it?
4. Now is time for the final drawing. Add color and the finishing details
5. Storytime: playing off the creativity of this creation, please have your kiddo write a story about this monster. Be sure to talk about the “ingredients” of a good story.
 - a. Character, plot, setting, conflict, and resolution.
 - b. This is a good handout resource to read to or for your kiddos.

1. Please cut these squares out and put them in a bowl or hat
