This summer, the Brigham Young University Folk Dance Ensemble and Mountain Strings were fortunate to attend two international folk dance festivals in Italy from July 22-Aug. 16. We were one of 7 groups at the Latium Fesitaval in Cori, Italy. Then we attended the Terranostra Festival in Apiro, Italy. There were 6 dance groups at this festival.

LATIUM Festival:

Our BYU group first attended the Latium festival in 1980 and then again in 2007. The townspeople of Cori (an old Roman city from the 6th centuryBC situated on top of a tall hill) still remembered our group! In fact, one gentlemen came to me when he saw our

The director of the group from Puerto Rico (Mimi) knew Mary Bee Jensen and told me that they had been at festivals together in the past. She was very excited to meet our group again.

- Performing at Villa d'Este Renaissance Gardens in Tivoli.
- Visiting Rome, Pompeii, and the isle of Capri.


