FOLK ENSEMBLE PERFORMS FOR B.P.E.C.

This past weekend the group was flown to San Francisco and featured in the *Opening Event* of the B.P.E.C., Annual Business Partner Executive Conference, hosted by IBM. The dancers were seen by over 5,500 business executives representing 75 nations. The event itself was overseen by top and high-powered executives of IBM corporation.

Craig Low, a BYU alumnus, with the assistance of Pete Codella, Performing Arts Management, was responsible for connecting BYU with IBM.

The six-minute event was a complex, multimedia spectacle which integrated sophisticated lasers and other special effects. Of special interest, REI, BYU, and Mazda were featured. Two giant screens introduced the audience to BYU's website beginning with our homepage, and then, working its way through Arts & Museums, Performing Groups, International Folk Dance Ensemble and video clips, ended with the students performing *Cry of the Celts* (our Irish hardshoe) on stage.

It was extremely professional and high profile. Our division is hoping for future doors to open as a result of this single event. It is another opportunity that has put BYU in front of the world.

Those producing the event (stage managers, technicians, etc.), were extremely

impressed by the quality of the performance, and of the students. We left "hard-core" professionals with tears in their eyes. They relayed to us as we left, that they hoped for the day they could work with us again. They even said that they would "spread this experience around" to their colleagues. One of the stage managers had just finished working with Lord of the Dance, in Hawaii. She complimented the students over and over regarding the high quality of their performance. She also expressed, if one could start each day with people of our students' caliber, and what they represent, how the world would be a better place.
