We performed for close to 50,000 students in Utah public schools, and an additional 2,000 spectators in assisted living homes, church activities, and other BYU and local performances. We were excited to have some "new to us" hand-me-down costumes that were donated by Ned and Marian Gault, along with some fun, new choreography we included in our show this year from Sweden, Italy, and Switzerland. Both really added to our performance. And Gary Larsen knocked himself out with a great new clog number that demonstrated the very latest in the clogging craze! If you come to Christmas Around the World this year you'll see it.

Our tour back to Nauvoo was certainly the extra cream and cherry on the top at the end of the summer! "We love to see the temple. . ." was on our mind and schedule several times throughout each day. It is situated right across the street from where we stayed, so it took less than 60 steps and 60 seconds to be at the front gate of the temple!

We performed our show "Cultural Rhythms" for an hour each evening at the Joseph Smith Academy Auditorium and packed the house each night. Other activities included a trip to Carthage, Quincy, Ramus, Warsaw, Yelrom, Montrose and Green Plains with performances in Keokuk and Fort Madison rounding out a very busy schedule.

And as the sweet Sister Missionary shared with us in the upper room of Carthage Jail, "We can't all be a Joseph Smith, but we can all be a Hyrum, who stood by his brother in life and death."
