


## Christmas Around the World: A Tapestry of Peace

# PAC Spends July and August in Italy and France



This past summer, the Performing Arts Company spent five and ½ weeks in Italy and France representing the United States at three International Folk Dance festivals—Castiglione del Lago and Festival della Collina (Cori), Italy and Confolens, France.

The festivals were a wonderful experience for the dancers. They were able to dance with groups from Venezuela, Latvia, Kamchatka (Russia), Chile, Martinique, Italy (Sbandieratori Dei Rioni De Cori) Colombia, Mexico, Turkey, Serbia, Bulgaria,

Daghestan (Russia), France, Greece, People's Republic of China, Tahiti, Cuba, Spain, and South Africa.

Highlights of the trip included gelato (ice cream), sightseeing days in Rome, Florence, Venice, and Paris, a special excursion to perform on the Isle of Capri, and an exceptional 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary festival in Confolens. They did not spare anything this year. And Mary Bee, accompanied by DeWayne Young met us in Confolens. Another highlight was the reunion of many friends in folk dance groups that we had previously been with before at other folk festivals.





We were hot in Italy and cold in France. One can never plan quite right. And for you that have gone to festivals in both places—the food was great in Italy...no surprise. But, it was also great in France! Confolens has really improved its menu and is certainly not serving the typical cuisine of the past.
