The International Folk Dance Ensemble (IFDE) consisting of 14 couples and 7 band members performed in Switzerland, France, and Belgium this past summer accompanied by Colleen West (Interim Artistic Director), Michael Romney (Assistant), Jonathon Wood (Tour manager), Mark Ohran (Technical director), and Ashley Taylor (Dance Athletic Trainer).

The ensemble was invited to perform at the Geneva United Nations 4th which included a

beautiful stage, lots of food, and dignitaries from all over the world. Three girls from our Mountain Strings Band came prepared to sing in acapella, the "Star Spangled Banner". Many audience members were moved to tears as they loudly applauded the harmonized, tender performance of Lucy, Alina, and Grace.





Our students also participated at three different folk festivals; "Chateau Gombert Festival" in Marseille, France, "Hello! Schoten Festival" in Schoten, Belgium, and at "Festival de Martigues" in Martigue, France. The European audiences, as you might remember from past tours, love, love, love, the Western cowboy image.... so our men were constantly photographed and cheered when dressed in their Cowboy hats, boot, and chaps. The students were able to interact with other groups from Mongolia, Georgia, Tartarstan, Mexico, Spain, Peru, Serbia, Ivory Coast, Italy, Guam, France, and Hungary. As always, attending folk festivals is an amazing event. The educational experiences, memories, and friendships the students encountered, will never be forgotten. The task of representing the USA, BYU, and the Church continues to be a great honor.

Inauguration of President Kevin Worthern

Performing in China

Five dancers from the BYU Dance Department were invited to perform at the 60th anniversary of The Bejing Dance Academy on Oct. 14, 2014. The dancers representing our department: one hoop dancer from Living Legends, two dancers from the contemporary area, and two International Folk Dance students (Jason Checketts and Emily Kleinkopf) who performed a clogging duet. As a result of previous encounters with the International Folk Dance Ensemble, the academy specifically requested clogging to part of this special performance!

Guest Choreographers

We are very excited to have three guest choreographers coming to work with our teams this fall. Ahmet Luleci came August 28-29 to rework his piece, "Tides of Anatolia" with the International Folk Dance Ensemble. He focused on simplifying and correcting the choreography to emphasize the Black Sea styling and technique.

The women of the IFDE will also have the opportunity to work with Marisol Encinias on October 23-26, on a new Flamenco choreography, which will be premiered in the upcoming *Christmas Around the World*. Marisol is a faculty member at the University of New Mexico specializing in Spanish and Flamenco dance. We are thrilled to have the opportunity to learn from her.

This year, the back-up team will also be able to learn from guest choreographer. BYU International Folk Dance alumnus, Gary Larsen, a full-time faculty member in dance at BYU Idaho, will teach a Haitian Creole dance, which will also be premiered in this year's *Christmas Around the World*. We are looking forward to learning from his expertise.

Special Update - Jeanette Geslison

Jeanette is currently an MFA (Masters of Fine Arts) candidate in dance at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. She has been absent from BYU for 6 months. During this time Colleen has been acting as the interim artistic director. She began her work in the low-residency program, designed for working professionals, this summer with a 7-week intensive semester. She is now back at BYU directing the International Folk Dance Ensemble and continues to work on her second semester which is done online at home. It is a very rigorous program with excellent faculty mentoring. Jeanette considers it an adventure being back in school again after a "few" years away, and says, "It has opened new doors with exciting new perspectives." (Note: The hiring trend for dance faculty in colleges and universities now requires a person to have a MFA or Doctorate degree. BYU is following this trend as they search for new faculty to fill openings in the Department of Dance.)
