Day to Day Summary:

Monday April 26

Checked into Helaman Halls at eight, picked up Nike shoes at ten, then attendees tech rehearsal for devotional in the RB theatre. Young Ambassadors, Vocal Point, and Mountain Strings performed musical numbers and Living Legends performed their prepared cultural numbers. We ended by practicing I am A Child of God where the first, second, and third verses were sung in a variety of languages (Tongan, Samoan, Icelandic, Korean, Chinese, Portuguese, Spanish) and all group performers sang the fourth verse in English. After that, lunch at the canon center then some free time. At four we had a rehearsal in 2206 to solidify workshops and the social media approach, as well as run some of the show numbers. A horde of dancers then descended on Chic Fil A in the Cougareat and then rushed back to the RB theatre for tech and dress rehearsal. The Young Ambassadors were running behind schedule and we got to catch the last half hour of their performance. After they left the dressing room, we set up and did tech and dress rehearsal. The second full run was made memorable by Young Ambassador member Brant Johnson who cheered us on. We ended at 11:30, headed back to the dorms, and went to bed.

Tuesday April 27

Lazy start to today as we didn't have any obligations until two. Breakfast and free time was everyone's personal choice and a group met up in the canon for lunch. After lunch, we grabbed our costumes and headed up to the Marriott Center for the President's dinner. We had about an hour and a half to kill before our tech time, and we spent it playing games. The games consisted of hangman, heads up, and flappy golf which was popular in both the men and women's dressing room. We then had our time to tech and space on the floor. After dinner was

served, it was time for the performances. We were quite surprised to see Elder and Sister Oaks sitting front and center clapping for us as we clogged. All the dance teams then headed to the WILK for a bowling activity. Those of us who were not as skilled spent our time skittle bowling. Choices were imitating our own dances, bowling with your non-dominant hand, being an animal, bowling with your eyes closed, and bowling with different body parts. Then off to bed to get ready for the early morning workshop.

Wednesday April 28

We got up and held a six am workshop targeting individuals in Asia. Afterwards we went to breakfast, then to the RB theatre for our show at ten. We performed and then went to lunch. We then got the honor to be an audience for Living Legends where we discovered it was a good thing we don't have to sing because we all were close to losing our voice by their ending number. After, we changed into twin day and went to the movie theatre in Geneva for a matinee showing of Raya and the Last Dragon. When we arrived at the theatre we were treated like royalty with a large drink, box of candy, and a bucket of popcorn for each person with the best seats in the house (one word: heated!). Afterwards, we traveled back home for dinner and then played a game in Budge Hall's common room. It was based off of the card game "What do you Meme?", but instead of using the provided cards, we used funny photos of the team.

Thursday April 29

We got up and watched Vocal Points seven am performance. Then we had breakfast and had a little downtime before our service project. McKenna took over BYU's official Instagram story, and went around with each of the performing groups. Our service project was hosted by Stitching Hearts and we were there to help with quilts, weave bed mats, pin masks, make ponchos, and make file folder games. We got two mats done and two quilts! Then it was back to the dorms to get ready for our own performance, with a quick blocking rehearsal beforehand in 2206. Our show was at four and then following the livestream we did a percussive workshop showcasing the differences between Irish, Clogging, and Tap. Dinner was next and then we went to a Rec night hosted by Living Legends in the Harman Building outdoor pavilion. They taught an Argentine dance, some Tahitian, and a potato dance traditionally done at Pow Wows. The winners from each section got Living Legends swag. Jaren from vocal point and Ashley won the Argentine competition, two ballroom dancers won the Tahitian, and Tasha and Brant from Young Ambassadors won the potato dance. Then we did a big circle dance/dance party, and headed back to the dorms to sleep for the early show.

Friday April 30

Today was our turn for the dreaded 7:00 am show. We had Vocal Point and Young Ambassadors in the audience to help cheer us on in the early morning hours. We then headed to breakfast then back to the RB Theatre to watch Living Legends. Lunch was next on the docket and then people split up to take naps and get ready for the Provo Rec center. People swam, did the rock wall, and had fun dominating the indoor water slides. Afterwards we all piled

in cars and drove to lan's house. His dad was kind enough to make us a variety of smoked pizza with homemade ice cream (raspberry and cookies & cream) as well as eclairs. Then we watched North Avenue Irregulars on an outdoor movie screen. When the movie finished, we packed up and went back to the dorms.

Saturday May 1

Another early morning for the folk dancers as we joined the Ballroom Company to watch the Young Ambassadors seven am show. After eating breakfast, we hosted a special online workshop for our families where we taught some kid friendly dances and the chorus of Discowale. It was so much fun to watch the screen full of smiling faces dancing along with us. We got ready for our performance and headed to the RB for a catered lunch and then a one pm performance. After we all went back to the dorms and dressed in 70/80's attire, we went to classic skating for disco skating with all the performing companies.

Sunday May 2

This was our beloved day to sleep in, church was done on your own and our first devotional was at four. The ladies wore our matching navy dresses and the boys looked sharp in their BYU blazers and green ties. Colin was our speaker for folk. Call time was at three for the devo at four. Then it was a fast Sunday dinner at the canon center and then back to the RB theatre for the last devotional of the day. Laura said the opening prayer and Clark was our speaker for this second devotional. Afterwards the girls had a ladies night and the boys had their own night/Colin's birthday party.

Monday May 3

Early morning devotional number one with a call time at six am. Isaiah was our first speaker and Tyler said the closing prayer. Then as a slow moving group, we were off to breakfast, then back for the second devotional. The wait was filled with the creation and sharing of memes. Truly the love language of this tour. The second speaker was Ashley. After the second devotional people either took a nap or played a game until it was time for the third devo. Elise was our final IFDE speaker. The next thing on the schedule was a workshop at four. We went back to the dorms common room and played hours of games including set, one night werewolf, and a massive round of physiatrist. We tried to get dinner at the creamery grill, but they were closed by the time we got there so we split up and bought different food items for a sort of potluck dinner we had at Tyler's apartment. Ending the night by playing quiplash and laughing at the ridiculous prompts and answers.

Tuesday May 4

This was another day to sleep in. Some of the company members went ahead to the LDS Motion Picture Studio to help move wagons and props for the Traveler Film shoot, while the rest of us did our own things in the morning. We met up for lunch at the canon center and

then had a combined workshop with Living Legends. We taught them a section of Discowale, and they taught us a mens and womens dance from Samoa. Afterwards we tried on boots for Traveler as well as worked through some spacing. Then we traveled down the stairs to the RB Theatre to watch the Ballroom Dance Company's final performance. Most of the girls went up to 278 RB to do their hair and makeup and the boys joined us for dinner that was catered by Magelbys. We met for final notes before our last performance that night at seven. After the show, some people had to run to be interviewed in the Hinkley center while others striked the stage, and the rest of us hurriedly put away costumes and drove up to the Harman building to begin setting up for Rec Night. All of the other companies joined us as we taught them Zemer Atik, Tismidga, Hene Ma Tov, Bhangra, La Bastringue, Scatter Squares, and Sto Mi E Milo. Hene Ma Tov and Bhangra were used as competition dances between the groups and the winners got Folk Dance Swag.

Afterwards, we packed up costumes, packed up dorm rooms for early checkout and Traveler Filming.

Wednesday May 5

We made our way to the LDS Motion Picture studio at 7:30 in the morning and were filming in the most adorable pioneer set. We started by filming the section with Shayne and Teagan since they had to leave for Nauvoo by nine. After that we started on the continuous one shot opening scene that included chickens, the Tucker twins, and some comically large logs. We filmed until twelve and then took a break for lunch. Coming back at two, we filmed a few shots at another part of the park and then made our way back to the original set. We continued to film throughout the day finally wrapping up around eight ending with recording the sounds of the mulch we were dancing on.
