I'm writing to thank you and your fellow members, on the occasion of your annual meeting, to recognize the contributions of the Friends of Sagamore Hill (FOSH) over the last twelve months at Sagamore Hill National Historic Site and in the local community of Oyster Bay, New York.

Over the last year FOSH supported multiple in-park events, including the 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Theodore Roosevelt Association's Annual Police Awards, the annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July commemoration, Constitution Day, TRA Weekend Birding at Sagamore Hill, as well as developed and sponsored Roosevelt-themed community events including "*History Comes Alive in Oyster Bay: A Rough Riders Reunion*," multiple lectures and talks including a Salute to National Park Services Volunteers, and extensive activities surrounding Halloween and Theodore Roosevelt's birthday.

The Friends of Sagamore Hill's significant contributions as both park partners and volunteers directly facilitates and expands the National Park Service's mission to educate visitors and our local communities about the legacy of President Roosevelt, the Roosevelt family and to preserve the remarkable place that is Sagamore Hill.
