

## 2014 John A. Gable Memorial Lecture Series

**Deborah Davis** is the author of *Guest of Honor: Booker T. Washington, Theodore Roosevelt, and the White House Dinner that Shocked a Nation,* which tells the story of the remarkable event that ignited a racial storm, divided the country, and threatened to topple two of America's greatest men (Atria/S&S). Her other works include *Strapless: John Singer Sargent and the Fall of Madame X* (Tarcher/Putnam, 2003), the story behind the legendary John Singer Sargent painting that propelled the artist to international renown but condemned his subject to a life of public ridicule; *Party of the Century: The Fabulous Story of Truman Capote and His Black and White Ball* (Wiley, 2006), which transports readers to the Oz-like splendor of New York in 1966, where Capote, at the pinnacle of his fame, threw himself the party to end all parties; and *Gilded: How Newport Became the Richest Resort in America* (Wiley, 2009), a colorful history of the fabled city from its first colonists to its new millennium millionaires. She has also written for the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post, Antiques*, and *Art and Antiques*.

**Hugh Howard** is the author of many books on architecture, art, and American history, including *Houses of the Founding Fathers, Mr. and Mrs. Madison's War, The Painter's Chair: George Washington and the Making of American Art,* and *Dr. Kimball and Mr. Jefferson: Rediscovering the Founding Fathers of American Architecture.* He lives in East Chatham, New York.
