Dr. Bruce Nash

Dr. Bruce Nash received his doctorate in Medical and Molecular Genetics from the University of Toronto and then studied at the University of Oregon before joining Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory's DNA Learning Center in 2005.

As Assistant Director for Science, he develops approaches that enable student-centered research that incorporate molecular biology and bioinformatics, including DNA barcoding. DNA barcoding can be used to identify species from the wild, in products, or in collections – including animal remains like those at Sagamore Hill.
