
## About Sagamore Hill

Sagamore Hill was the permanent home of our 26<sup>th</sup> President, Theodore Roosevelt, overlooking Oyster Bay Harbor, New York. It is a unique American treasure filled with trophies, gifts, books, paintings, bronzes, flags and weapons that form a mosaic of his life. The home is a fascinating picture of American country life and household technology at the turn of the 20th Century. It is a simple fact that the moment you ascend the hill and see the house, you smile.

The 23 room Queen Anne style structure was his dream house. This solid frame and brick home was built during 1884-1885 after his first child Alice was born and his first wife, Alice Hathaway Lee, died tragically of Bright's disease.

In 1886 Theodore married Edith Kermit Carow and, together, they raised their energetic family and spent the rest of their lives at Sagamore Hill. TR, a devoted family man, enjoyed playing with his six children - Alice, Theodore Jr., Kermit, Ethel, Archibald and Quentin - and working in his fields.

On September 14, 1901, TR became president and Sagamore Hill became the nation's first "Summer White House" for his nearly two presidential terms. TR hosted many national and international conferences, entertained dignitaries, negotiated the Russo-Japanese War's end, spearheaded the Panama Canal, led the charge against monopolistic trusts and established federal protection of millions of acres of land.



On January 6, 1919, Theodore Roosevelt died at Sagamore Hill peacefully in his sleep at age 60. His widow, Edith, died here in 1948 at age 87. This home was only occupied by the Roosevelts. Its appearance with original furnishings has little changed. It is an American treasure and a significant piece of the Theodore Roosevelt legacy that must be preserved for all future generations.





- The Gutzon Borglum artistic presidential eagle as well as TR's dressing room.
- The Site's entrance sign and the "Chicken Coop."

There are many other projects we have paid for, but membership dues and donations are needed to fund many, many more projects and activities in the future.
