Police Information

The Hampton Township Police Department (HTPD) is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 12/14/2025—1/19/2026:

Vehicle Accident

On 1/19/26, HTP officer was conducting a traffic enforcement detail on Route 8 when he observed a vehicle traveling southbound at a high rate of speed. He observed the vehicle strike a curb then a guardrail. After striking the guardrail, the vehicle had a change of direction and crossed over the double yellow lines and struck another vehicle that was traveling northbound on Route 8. Both vehicles were towed from the scene.

Road Hazard

On 1/15/26, HTP responded to a call regarding a tree that had fallen on the roadway near McCully Road and Kenson Drive. Upon arrival, officers located the tree which was leaning into the roadway and creating a hazard. Hampton Department of Public Works (DPW) was notified and responded and removed the obstruction from the roadway.

Utility Complaint

On 1/6/26, HTP were dispatched to the area of Route 8 and East Bardonner Road for a possible transformer fire. County

dispatch advised they were receiving multiple calls regarding power outages and non-functioning traffic lights. Upon arrival, officers observed the traffic lights at Shopper's Plaza and Route 8/East Bardonner Road to be completely out. Duquesne Light was notified and responded to the area. Hampton

the lives of students that many have gone on to continue their music careers after graduation, learning firsthand just how far their music can take them. While several recent graduates have continued their marching careers in college, three had the great privilege of participating in this year's college football playoffs: Michael Bacasa (HHS 2022) plays sousaphone in The Ohio State University Marching Band; Sophia DiMaria (HHS 2025) plays tenor saxophone in the Indiana University Marching Band; and Zach Harrington (HHS 2022) is a Drum Major in the James Madison University Marching Band.

Having spent three years playing sousaphone in one of the na-

tion's most famous college bands, Michael shares "I am one of 28 sousaphones in the band, and I've gotten to travel all over the country for bowl games—the Rose Bowl, the Cotton Bowl, and the Big 10 Championship—and even one National Championship win last year!"

Michael has served as an assistant squad leader of one of the sousaphone sections, and this spring, he will join the

band in Ireland to march in the St. Patrick's Day parade. In Fall 2026, he will have the extraordinary honor of dotting the "i" in the band's famous script OHIO during one of the halftime shows. This is an honor bestowed upon select senior sousaphone players in recognition of their dedication and skill.

Another member of the HHS Class of 2022 made an appearance during the college football playoffs, as Zach Harrington led the James Madison University Marching Royal Dukes as one of their drum majors. Now a senior, Zach looks back on his time in the band with great fondness, explaining, "Being a part of the band has been one of the best times of

the project himself. "I told him he could do it," Jamie laughed, "as long as it was neat, organized, and didn't have wires hanging everywhere." Brad delivered, and then some!

This year marks their third season creating the display entirely on their own. What started as a Halloween project, with 12-foot skeletons, giant light up spiders and thrilling music echoing up the driveway, quickly grew into something spectacular. "People would sit out in their lawn chairs across the street and enjoy the Halloween display," Brad said. "We'd get over 100 trick-or-treaters."

The Christmas season took things even further. Brad researched how to synchronize lights to music and last year purchased a low FM transmitter, carefully tuning it to 91.7 FM. Now, visitors can park, turn on their radios, and watch the house dance to a playlist Jamie curates, often with requests. "A lot of young girls were asking for pop music for New Year's, especially Taylor Swift," Jamie said. Brad agreed, though he joked he must approve every song since he hears each one "over and over" while programming. With each song taking about five hours to code, and a playlist of 10-12 tracks, it's a true labor of love.

The scale is staggering: 30,000 pixels across the property, a 23 foot "Mega-Tree", a massive 200,000 pixel panel which plays videos and movie clips and a smaller 20,000 pixel panel displaying the radio tune in sign. They begin setup a month in advance, with nearly two



weeks dedicated solely to programming. Even teardown is a feat, carefully storing props, electrical boards, and matrix panels in the garage and two sheds. Brad's meticulousness shines here too.

This past year came with an unexpected challenge. After Brad tore his bicep in July, he couldn't use one arm until December. Braden and Gavin stepped in, operating the lift and helping with 50 foot installs. Their teamwork kept the tradition alive.

The community response has been overwhelming. Neighbors send cards, fan mail, and handwritten notes. Jamie even checked to make sure the music and lights weren't too much for the neighborhood. "They enjoy it too," she said with relief. A Facebook page: *Lights on Vitullo* and YouTube videos help share the magic even further.





my life. From making lifelong friends to traveling across the country on our historic playoff appearance...I'm so glad I took the leap to join this college marching band!"

In Bloomington, Indiana, another Hampton alum, Sophia DiMaria, is finishing up her freshman year at Mr. Himmeler's alma mater, Indiana University. When she first stepped onto the IU campus last April, she knew she was making her college decision, but she never could have predicted what was to come. Initially drawn to a much smaller school in New York, Sophia ultimately chose IU because, she wisely noted, "You can't make a small school big, but you can make a big school small. If I join the marching band, that makes IU a smaller school."

Today, Sophia reflects on what is best described as a dream season, as the Indiana Hoosiers made history on the football field by going undefeated (16-0)

Having now traveled to Indianapolis, Pasadena, Atlanta, and Miami within six weeks, Sophia says, "This is not what I expected...coming back [to campus] on December 26th and going on all these trips; but I loved every minute of it!"

Cyber Safety Avoiding Tech Support Scams

Pop-up warnings that claim your computer has a serious security problem—often appearing to come from companies like Microsoft or Apple—are a common tactic in tech support scams. These messages are designed to create panic and convince you something is wrong with your device. Scammers then pose as tech support and offer to “fix” the issue for a fee, when no real problem exists.

Frozen Screens, Fake Warnings

A common tech support scam starts with a pop-up that pretends your computer has a serious security issue and urges you to call a listed number. The pop-up may freeze your screen and warn against restarting. If you call, a scammer posing as tech support will ask for remote access to “fix” the problem, then use that access to steal your data or install malware.

Don't Fall For Unsolicited Calls

Another tech support scam involves criminals contacting you by phone, email, or text



and claiming your computer has a problem. They pressure you to pay—often through wire transfers, gift cards, or cryptocurrency—for a fake repair. In reality, there was never anything wrong, and any money you send is simply stolen.

What Can I Do to Stay Safe?

Awareness of tech support scams can help protect you, your computer, and your finances. Remember these tips to protect yourself:

- Real organizations will never contact you unexpectedly about a computer problem and ask you to call a phone number. If a pop-up freezes your computer screen, restart. If you receive an unexpected call, hang up.
- If someone contacts you unexpectedly, you should never let them have remote access to your computer. If you need technical support, always contact the organization using official contact information.
- Cybercriminals often try to create a sense of urgency to pressure you into making a quick decision, so always stop and think before you act!





Strengthening Consumer Protections in Home Equity Agreements

As many people are currently struggling with their finances, a way to make money quickly can seem beneficial. One way some have attempted this is by entering a Shared Appreciation Agreement, a novel financial instrument in which a homeowner receives funds in exchange for granting a third party a future interest in their home's appreciation, equity, or value.

However, unfair and deceptive marketing in this industry can make it unclear that those who sign these agreements may have to pay back far more than they originally agreed to, causing even further financial

hardship.

That is why I am leading a bipartisan group of legislators in introducing [H.B. 2120](#) to require that Shared Appreciation Agreements meet the same safeguards that apply to mortgages and other home-secured financial instruments.

These protections would ensure that consumers are provided with disclosure requirements, foreclosure safeguards, and remedies for violations before they put pen to paper and approve their agreement.

Homeowners should be provided with trustworthy, honest language before they commit to an agreement that affects ownership of their home. This legislation would ensure that consumers better understand a financial transaction affecting what is often their most valuable financial asset, their home.
