Police Information

The Hampton Township Police Department (HTPD) is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 4/8/2026—5/10/2026:

Retail Theft

On May 8th, 2026, HTPD were contacted by Home Depot regarding a push-out/ theft of merchandise at the Allison Park store on May 5th, 2026. They provided a case file for the incident along with images of the suspect, who was later identified, and the suspect vehicle information.

Officers were able to compare images of the suspect in police databases to images Home Depot sent, in which they were able to positively identify him.

The suspect will be charged with one felony count of retail theft via arrest warrant. District Justice Magistrate Tom Swan reviewed and signed the arrest warrant on May 11th, 2026.

DUI Arrest

On April 8th, 2026, while on patrol the officer observed a motorized go-cart stopped in their lane, facing against traffic. The officer stopped due to the lane being blocked. Once in contact with the driver, the officer became aware of a strong odor of alcohol coming from the person, and their speech was slurred.

Standardized field sobriety tests were administered. During testing they showed multiple indicators of impairment on all tests. A preliminary breath test was positive for alcohol. Based on the totality of circumstances the driver was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI.

On April 29th, 2026, a burglary was reported in which a known suspect entered a business and stole approximately \$5,000 worth of concrete related equipment and diesel fuel. A warrant was issued for the suspect. Later the same day, Moon Township Police located the suspect at a hotel and took him into custody. The suspect made statements claiming he had permission to take the items and had paid for them. The suspect was transported to county authorities, and the warrant was cleared from NCIC. The victim was notified of the arrest and the upcoming preliminary hearing.

Fire

On May 1st, 2026, HTPD were dispatched to Linwood Drive for a reported oven fire. Hampton Fire was also notified to respond. Upon arrival, Peebles Fire Department was on scene, had extinguished the fire, and had begun ventilating smoke from inside the residence. Hampton Township Fire Marshal Kohan arrived on scene and assumed control of the investigation.

Domestic Disturbance

On May 2nd, 2026, the HTPD were dispatched to the Quality Inn for a reported domestic dispute. Officers located a female victim in a hotel room with visible injuries. Based on the victim's statements and observed injuries, officers took the male into

custody. He was evaluated by EMS, medically cleared at a hospital, transported to the HTP station for processing, and then taken to the county jail once charges were completed.

Vehicle Accident

On April 4th, 2026, officers responded to a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of N. Pioneer Rd. and W. Hardies Rd. Both vehicles had moderate front-end damage but were drivable. Shaler/Hampton EMS evaluated both drivers, who refused transport.

Suspicious Incident

On May 10th, 2026, HTPD were dispatched to Sample Road for a report of possible human remains near the railroad tracks. The caller, who had been walking her dog along the Rachel Carson Trail, reported a foul odor and believed she saw a human skull and clothing from a distance. Officers searched the area and located the object in question, which was determined to be a deer carcass. No human remains or evidence of a suspicious death were found.

history, which reaches back to some of the earliest battles on our nation's journey to independence. Honored to share her family's story, Julie explained that a simple DNA taste turned into a mission, leading her on a journey of discovery that has changed her life.

Learning that her ancestors were among the earliest settlers of Pennsylvania, Julie shared, "Families like mine were among the thousands encouraged to settle in William Penn's Pennsylvania — a place that promised something almost revolutionary for that time: freedom of conscience, freedom of worship, and the hope of building a life without tyranny." She also discovered that she had at least four grandfathers who served in the Revolutionary War, "so," she added, "I did what any good great-granddaughter would do: I went looking for them."

Her sleuthing led her to multiple epiphanies, perhaps none stronger than the reality that, "Freedom is not an abstract idea. Freedom has names, freedom has faces, freedom has grieving families. To every veteran here today," she continued, "to every active-duty military member, to every Gold Star family carrying the unbearable weight of loss, and to every veteran...who still carries the memory of a friend who never made it home, thank you. Today, we remember them...and we will not forget their sacrifice."

Right on cue, the short-lived drizzle gave way to the tiniest glimmer of sun behind the clouds, and Julie made a request. "Please do not take this freedom for granted," she pleaded. "Take care of America, protect her character, and honor the sacrifices that built her."

For more than 30 years, one of North Park's most beloved landmarks has stood closed but never forgotten. Now, the Allegheny County Parks Foundation is inviting the community to help

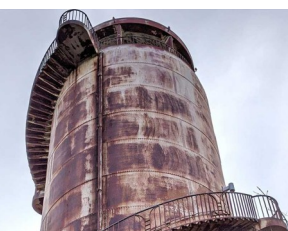


"Bring Back the View" by restoring the historic North Park Observation Tower.

Built in 1937, the Observation Tower

was originally designed as a water storage tank but quickly became a destination. Visitors who climbed its 154-step spiral staircase were rewarded with a breathtaking 360-degree view of North Park and beyond. The 102-foot tower, featuring vintage terrazzo floors and a domed ceiling, became a cherished part of the North Park experience.

Recent structural assessments confirm the tower is in good condition allowing the project to move forward. Plans



include full interior and exterior restoration, safety and code-compliant upgrades, repainting in its original historic color and restoration of the viewing platform and architectural details.

In addition to the tower it-

self, the surrounding site will be completely reimagined as a new destination within North Park. Improvements will include accessible pathways, a welcoming plaza, native landscaping and a one-acre wildflower meadow along the entrance drive. New seating areas, shade trees and interpretive signage will create an inviting place for visitors to gather, learn and experience the landscape in a new way.

Community support will make this transformation possible. Every gift helps restore this iconic landmark and create a new experience at North Park where visitors can once again climb the tower, enjoy the view and connect with the park for generations to come.

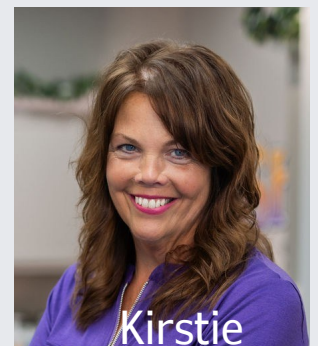

Last month, County Council introduced legislation (13892-26) that would create periodic regular reassessments on a rolling three-year cycle beginning in 2028. Pennsylvania is the only state that does not require a regular schedule for property reassessments. Ideally, our state legislature would act on this issue and require all counties to do regular reassessments. In the ab-

sence of state action, I believe it is prudent for Allegheny County Council to require such a system. Given the significance of such a change, my colleagues on Council and I are seeking input from residents and property owners across the county at a series of hearings. The next ones will be held:
