Students Earn Recognition by Merit Scholarship Program

Three Aquinas Academy of Pittsburgh and two Hampton High School seniors have been recognized by the 2025 National Merit Scholarship Program (NMSP) for their high scores on their PSAT Exams. Clara You (Aguinas Academy), Carolyn Clutter (HHS) and Nathan Gardner (HHS) were named semifinalist while Eliana BouSamra and John Ortiz (Aquinas Academy) earned commended status. Recognition by the NMSP is initially based on scores from the junior year Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Semifinalists' scores are among the top 16,000 scores (top 1%) and Commended students scores' are among the top 50,000 (top 2%) of the juniors who took the test in the fall of 2023.

As semifinalists, Clara, Carolyn and Nathan may choose to continue in the competition for scholarship opportunities and a chance to be named a finalist or scholar in June of 2025. "These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 6,870 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$26 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship® award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the finalist level of the competition. About 95 percent of the semifinalists are expected to attain finalist standing, and approximately half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholar-



TIP OF THE MONTH:

Labor and building materials are typically the least expensive around this month, so utilize this to your advantage if you've been needing to make household updates or renovations to increase the marketability of your home. Aiden's Helping Hands was founded by Hampton High School senior Aiden Hanna, after his own battle with osteosarcoma, a rare bone cancer with which he was diagnosed in the summer of 2022. Upon receiving his diagnosis, Hanna was surrounded by friends and family who rushed to support him. However, he was struck by the realization that not all families fighting cancer have the same level of support. Inspired to make a difference, he launched his charity to alleviate the financial burden on families and create positive experiences for patients outside the ri-

gors of treatment.



Michael Patrick Trimm comes from a family of storytellers and has loved acting since he was in elementary school, when he performed with Act One. You may remember seeing him in many productions while he attended Hampton Middle School and Hampton High School. The 2012 HHS graduate has built on those experiences to establish a career as an actor and an acting/audition coach. He most recently performed as Lesgate in the fast-paced and funny 'Dial M for Murder' at the Pittsburgh Public Theater during its September run.

"Hampton has such a phenomenally curated performing arts program," explained Trimm. "Dan Franklin (HHS musical director) was a large part of why I went into it (acting). He is a great arts teacher and an even better person." Trimm attended Ithaca College in Ithaca, NY to focus on acting. He even studied abroad for a semester at a film school in Prague. "Studying arts in Europe is pretty great," expressed Trimm.

After college, Trimm found success in New York but when the pandemic shut everything

down, he moved back to Pittsburgh. The time at home found him focusing inward on how to differentiate himself as an actor in an oversaturated market. He turned that time into an opportunity, not only for himself, but for other aspiring actors. That translated into his ability to shine in auditions and he coaches other actors to do the same.

Trimm described acting as a collaborative career with a lot of networking. "Talent only gets you so far. Being a professional is worth its weight in gold," said Trimm. "The best way to network is to show up on time and do a good job." He has traveled to various

places in the country for theatre or film jobs. "I've been quite lucky to get a lot of experience."

Trimm's next stop will be in Cleveland in early 2025 for a co-production of 'King James' between Cleveland Playhouse and City Theatre and a one -man show called 'The Smuggler' slated for June at Riley's Pour House in Carnegie.

Trimm resides on the North Side of Pittsburgh with his girlfriend Clarise Fearn and his German Shepherd/Labrador mix Ellie. His mom Patricia Prozzi still lives in Hampton, his younger sister is at Ohio State and his older brother is in Memphis.

Voter Registration Scam and Prepare to Vote

Election Day continues to draw closer and closer, but that proximity is also bringing out bad actors trying to undermine the trust of voters.

One of the latest fraudulent campaigns involves entities sending scam texts claiming to be from "Volunteers with Voter Protection" or "Voter Protection" and saying there are issues with a voter's registration. The texts urge the voter to "call the Board of Elections" with a number listed in the message.

Instead, I encourage you to verify your voter registration status with the Allegheny County Elections Division or
