

New Coach and New Look for Bocce Team

Entering the 8th season of Bocce, the sport continues to grow.

The Hampton Unified Bocce team has a new coach this year. Coach and Hampton High School guidance counselor Terri Koprivnikar shared, "I am coaching the

bocce team for the first time this year and it is a blast. We have two full teams that are comprised of half "athletes" - students with intellectual disabilities (IDD) and half "partners," students without IDD. We compete in the Northern region

(Hampton, PR, North Allegheny, North Hills, Avonworth, Shaler and Northgate)." Although many players graduated last year (there are only 5 returning players), they had no trouble recruiting new players.

Police Information

The Hampton Township Police Department (HTPD) is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 12/17/2024—1/20/2025:

Fire

On 1/20/2025, HTPD officers were dispatched to Hieber Road for a shed fire. Upon arrival, Hampton Fire Units were putting out the fire. Hampton Fire Marshal was on-scene.

Vehicle Accident

On 12/21/2024, the HTPD was dispatched to the area of Wildwood Rd and Hardt Rd. for a report of a single vehicle rollover accident with entrapment. Hampton Fire along with Peebles Fire assisted with traffic control and extricating the driver. Shaler /Hampton EMS treated the driver for his injuries prior to transporting him to the hospital. Leo's Towing removed the vehicle. Prior to reopening the road Hampton DPW treated the roads for icy conditions.

On 01/16/2025, HTPD officers were dispatched to Richland Rd. for a report of a single vehicle accident into a tree. Upon arrival, officers found the vehicle to be off the side of the road and over a small hill. The driver was able to self-extricate from the vehicle. After being checked by EMS

the driver denied any need for transport. Leo's Towing removed the vehicle, and the driver was given a courtesy ride by an Officer to where he was going to wait for an Uber ride.

On 1/18/2025, HTPD were dispatched to the area of West Hardies Road for a report of a vehicle that took out a telephone pole, with power lines down. Upon arrival on scene, they observed an Allegheny County DPW salt truck off the roadway and surrounded by potentially live power lines. Hampton Fire was on scene and encouraged the driver to stay in the vehicle. Duquesne Light was notified and arrived on scene and deemed the scene safe as power was turned off. Rescue efforts were then able to be started.

Kirsopp's Legacy Documented in New Film

Over 350 people gathered in the Greater Pittsburgh Masonic Center in Ross Township on December 28 to witness the life story of the late Hampton police sergeant Rob Kirsopp in a 100-minute documentary; as told by himself, his family, and people from the community. Prior to the showing, Kirsopp's wife Rosalyn took a few moments with her children Robbie, Ray, and Rachel by her side, to thank the community. "We have nothing but gratitude for all that has been done to help our family. My heart is so full." Kirsopp passed away on May 1 after a 5-year battle with cancer.

Robbie talked to his mom about doing a film about his dad's life but had no experience in making a movie. He posted on Facebook asking for help. Robbie mapped out a timeline and volunteers began contacting him. Many of the people that offered to help, he didn't know, and they even brought their own equipment. The film was shot in a weekend with 4 teams of 3-4 people each. Thirty-eight people were interviewed in less than 8 hours.

"Every second I worked on this project, I had a smile on my face," said Robbie. He edited the film on his own for a couple months but realized he needed help. He reached out online and found editor Hunter Brockmann from Cincinnati, Ohio, who edited the entire film and was another one of the amazing volunteers that Robbie didn't know when he started this project.

The movie premiere was a benefit for IATW (It's About the Warrior), an organization that helps veterans in the tri-state area, led by US Air Force veteran Steve Monteleone. "That was a goal of mine with the movie. My dad was always helping people because it made him happy. We wanted to turn around and help IATW as a thank you." IATW held a benefit for the Kirsopp family and started a scholarship in Rob

Kirsopp's name. Robbie raised \$5,040 for IATW at the premiere. When asked about the atmosphere at the premiere, Robbie replied "There are no words to describe it. It's phenomenal."

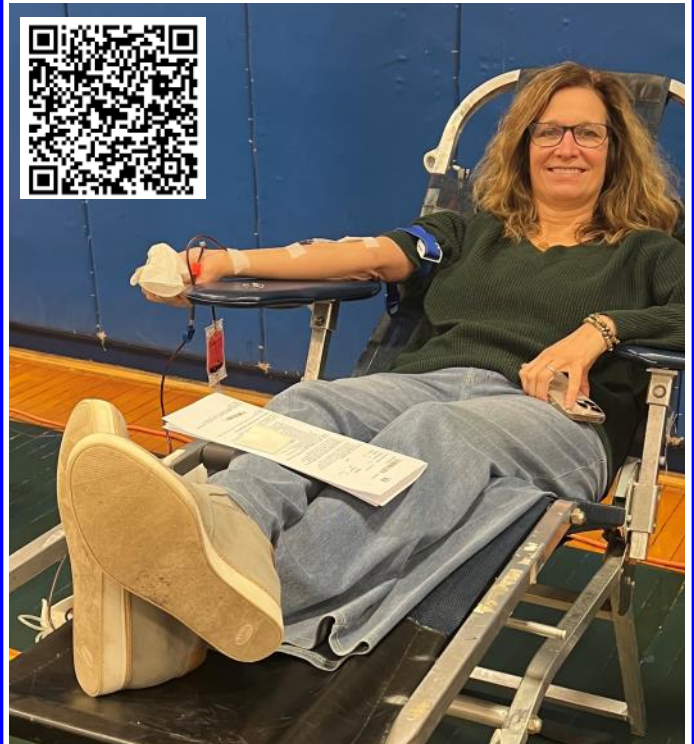

Meet An Officer

Ben Colosimo

Many jobs involve being a problem solver, and that is one of the things officer Ben Colosimo likes most about being a Hampton Township police officer, along with helping people on what may be the worst day



of their life. Colosimo grew up in Shaler and graduated with a degree in Exercise Science from Community College of Allegheny County. He then felt a pull toward law enforcement and graduated from the Police Academy in December of 2018. Both Hampton Township and Reserve Township hired Colosimo in part-time positions right out of the Academy, but he became a full-time officer in Hampton in July of 2021.

When an accident happens that involves

bodily injury or a fatality, Colosimo is called to the scene as he is a certified Accident Reconstructionist. All parties involved in the accident may have different perspectives on what happened or what caused the accident, but it is up to Colosimo to gather information, reconstruct the scene, and make determinations on what caused the accident. "It is one big puzzle where all of the pieces are scattered on the ground and it's my job to put them all together," he explained.

Colosimo collects readings from the vehicles including airbag readings, studies roadway conditions, determines vehicle speeds, obtains driver perspectives, and whether alcohol or drugs were involved through a very lengthy procedure. "It's extremely challenging. It's most challenging when you get all of your measure-

ments and calculations entered into special formulas, that it makes sense and is accurate," he said. All findings from A-Z are put into a very lengthy report which is submitted to the District Attorney's office for review and to determine if criminal charges are recommended. To obtain the Accident Reconstructionist certification, Colosimo completed three levels of training; Level 1: On-Scene, Level 2: Technical, and Level 3: Reconstruction.

Colosimo lives in Ross Township with his wife Alexa and their two golden doodles Sadie and Stella. He enjoys doing DIY projects in his house, like the basement he recently refinished, playing golf, and spending time with his wife.

HHS Senior Earns Eagle Scout Award

Ever since Scouts BSA (Boy Scouts of America) began accepting girls into its ranks in 2018, many young ladies in the region have enjoyed participating, learning invaluable skills that will last a lifetime. Three years ago, current Hampton High School senior Elizabeth Haytock followed in her older brother's footsteps by joining Scouts BSA and, like him, she has successfully earned the organization's highest rank, Eagle Scout. The Eagle Scout rank is the highest level of achievement in the Scouts BSA program, reflecting the scout's character development and a dedication to making a positive impact on society. An Eagle Scout demonstrates dedication, leadership skills, and a commitment to serving their community.

Because the organization requires female and male troops to remain separate, Elizabeth had to search for an all-female troop in the area. Though there are no female troops in Hampton, she was welcomed to join one of the three female troops in neighboring townships. Elizabeth chose Troop 9329, a McCandless-based troop that operates out of Memorial Park Church. The Laurel Highlands Council of Scouts BSA, which serves Pennsylvania along with portions of West Virginia and Maryland, comprises several districts, one of which is the Seneca District that serves this region. Elizabeth passed her Board of Review on December 30th, and her Court of Honor will be held in June.

Several achievements are required to earn the rank of Eagle Scout, not the least of which is the completion of a community service project, from proposal and planning to execution and leadership. In selecting her project, Elizabeth turned to her church, North Park Church, where she had already been working with the children's ministry. After assessing potential needs and discussing ideas with the children's ministry director, Elizabeth elected to create a space that would be specifically geared toward serving families.

"My project," she explains, "is a family resource center in my church. I cleaned out and painted an area, and with some help from my dad, I built a shelving unit and placed baskets to hold a variety of books and pamphlets, all designed to help families."

In looking back on her time with Scouts BSA, Elizabeth says, "My favorite thing about scouting was the community we had in working together, especially on campouts. My troop is very closely paired with boys' Troop 329, and we all just really enjoyed this bond we created."

BSA Troop 9329 is led by Scoutmaster Julie Yacoviello, a seasoned leader whose own daughter became the troop's first Eagle Scout in 2022. Since the troop was founded in October of 2020, four young ladies have already earned the Eagle Scout rank, a trend that seems destined to continue. In reflecting on Elizabeth's project and everything she's accomplished during her years in scouting, Julie is happy to share some insight on the young woman she has come to know.

"Elizabeth is very faith driven," she explains, "and her relationship with her faith and her reverence is integral to her development. She did this project that is connected to her home

church because it means so much to her."

A passionate advocate for scouting, Julie emphasizes, "Scouting is for all youth, regardless of gender. It's of benefit to all young people, particularly for character development. You learn to embrace the challenges in life and use that difficulty to learn to try again."

ideas on what you think they should be? If so, I'm excited to report that Hampton has started the process of completing the first major rewrite and modernization of our zoning and land use ordinances in over 20 years. Last fall, the Township sent out a request for proposals to various consulting firms for assistance with this update process. Strategic Solutions LLC out of Pittsburgh was selected for the contract and has already begun the process of reviewing the current zoning and land use ordinances and interviewing staff members about areas where the laws could be changed. A steering committee has been formed that is comprised of two members from each of Hampton's advisory boards and Council, as well as a representative from the school district. The update process is just beginning, and it will take the remainder of the 2025 calendar year to complete. There will be numerous opportunities coming up for public engagement. If you have suggestions for changes to the ordinance, please visit the Township website page titled "2025 Zoning and Land Use Update" where you can find information on all public events as they are scheduled, you can read the Township's scope of work and the proposal that was submitted by Strategic Solutions, and you can submit your ideas or suggestions right on that page. Or, if you'd prefer to email in your suggestions, please send them to zoningordinance@hampton-pa.org. The Zoning Ordinance dictates how all properties in Hampton can be developed and used, and it can have a tremendous impact on residents' daily lives. As such, I encourage all interested residents to submit your comments so that your voice is heard during the steering committee's discussions.

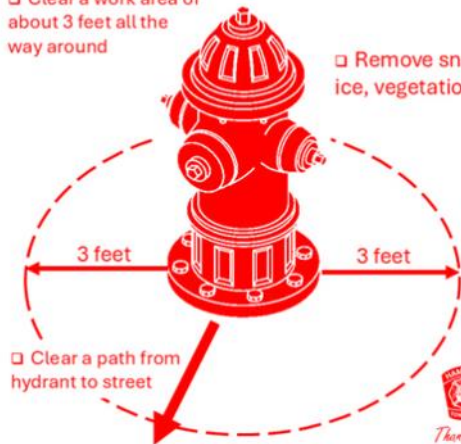

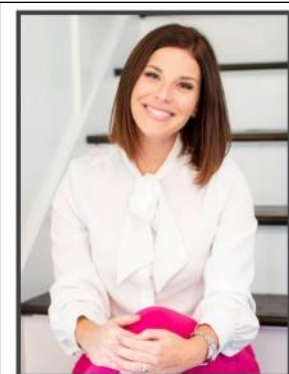

I'm also proud to advocate for state resources for our community. As a recent example, an \$85,000 state grant was awarded to the A.W. Beattie Career Center, to modernize its Homeland Security, Law Enforcement, Firefighting and related programs with a new ambulance trainer package.

The career center does tremendous work in helping to prepare high school students for multiple careers, and these monies will bolster its efforts to give students a more accurate example of the skills needed to succeed.
