Hampton Woman Benefits from Jumbled Storyline

When Hampton resident Jessica Camacho-Cook elected to donate a kidney to Shalereen Deven Wilson, her hope was to give Deven a chance to live a long, happy life free of the dialysis machines he'd been relying on three times a week. Deven had been waiting for a new kidney since last summer, and upon learning of his condition last October, Jessica

Police Information

The Hampton Township Police Department (HTPD) is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 1/19/2026—2/10/2026:

DUI Arrest

On 2/3/2026, HTP were dispatched to the area of William Flinn Highway and East Bardonner Road for a report of an erratic driver. The vehicle in question was located in a parking lot on Wildwood Rd. While speaking with the operator, officers detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. After field sobriety testing was performed the operator was arrested for suspicion of DUI.

Vehicle Accident

On 2/2/2026, HTP were dispatched to the area of William Flinn Highway and Mount Royal Boulevard for an accident involving four vehicles. One individual was transported to the hospital by Shaler/ Hampton EMS, and another was transported by private vehicle for further evaluation of possible injuries. Three vehicles were towed from the scene.

On 2/4/26, the HTP were dispatched to the area of the Spay Neuter Clinic, 3967 William Flinn Hwy., for a motor vehicle accident. Allegheny County dispatch advised that two vehicles were reported to be involved, one of the vehicles being a school bus.

Upon arrival, two vehicles were observed to be involved, both blocking both north bound travel lanes of William Flinn Highway. All parties denied injury. Two vehicles were towed from the scene and Hampton Fire Units cleaned fluid from the roadway.

ness boxing can help improve dopamine production, easing symptoms and slowing disease progression. Fit 4 Boxing general manager Brett Burkhart emceed the gala alongside Mike Clark, co-anchor of Pittsburgh's WTAE's Action News 4. Together, they opened the evening with a feature presentation honoring this year's Rock Steady Boxing nominee, Gibsonsia resident Ron Lunardi.

An accomplished accountant, Lunardi served his community for more than 40 years before retiring after his Parkinson's

diagnosis. With the support of his wife Chris and Fit 4 Boxing owner Rich Mushinsky, he has attended classes and private lessons at the Hampton club for over a decade. Burkhart says Lunardi has successfully staved off symptoms thanks to the rigorous program. "The progress we see here is remarkable," he said. "Ron has done a bit of both—warding off progression and seeing improvements. He truly deserved the lifetime achievement award."

Each week, Lunardi joins more than 100 Parkinson's fighters who "fight back"

against their disease. He credits Rock Steady Pittsburgh with keeping him healthy, saying, "It saved my life. I don't know where I'd be without these guys." stepped in with a lifeline. Fate intervened, however, completely changing the plot line of the story. Now, it seems, it is Deven who saved Jessica's life (though Jessica's friends are quick to point out that her altruistic instinct is what set it all in motion).

"When I discovered I was a potential match for Deven, I went in for more tests. One of these," she explains, "was a specialized donor CT scan used to map my kidney. It's much more detailed than a routine imaging, and because of that, they discovered a suspicious cyst. It turned out to be cancer, and it hadn't shown up on any other tests." With a sense of wonderment, she adds, "It saved my life."

On December 16, Jessica underwent surgery to remove her kidney to prevent the cancer from growing and

metastasizing. She was home in time to celebrate Christmas with her 7-year-old son, William, and today, she is feeling healthy and blessed. Jessica shares much of what she has

learned since diagnosis, explaining that kidney cancer usually isn't discovered until it becomes symptomatic. "By that time," she says, "it's usually already spread, and the survival rate is very low. Since mine was caught so early, though, I'm now cancer-free!"

A native of Kansas City, MO, Jessica didn't know anyone in the area when she moved here with her husband, Matt. Tragically, Matt died in January 2019 from a snowboarding accident, just a few months after William was born. Jessica suddenly became a single mom living in a strange new place. Upon reflection, she says she did-

n't really expect to stay, but again,

fate had other plans: "This neighborhood, this town, everyone has been such a blessing! So many people have rallied around William and me, first when Matt died and now through all of this. Though," she adds with a bit of wry smile, "I could do with a bit less tragedy, I am so grateful to live here. William and I have made a family here, and I can't imagine living anywhere else."

In a story punctuated by serendipity at every turn, it's significant to note that Jessica's diagnosis came seven years to the date of her husband's accident. Furthermore, Deven, the young man who became the impetus for Jessica's happy ending, has found hope of his own: a post in a Facebook group created by his family noted that February 14th was National Donor Day; the very next day, they received the phone call that all donor families dream of, informing them that a donor kidney had been found for Deven. He underwent surgery on the 16th and, surrounded by family, friends, and the exceptional care team at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, he has begun the difficult recovery period that will hopefully lead him to good health and a long, happy life.

Clear in her intent on raising awareness for kidney donation, Jessica continues to advocate for Deven and others in similar situations. 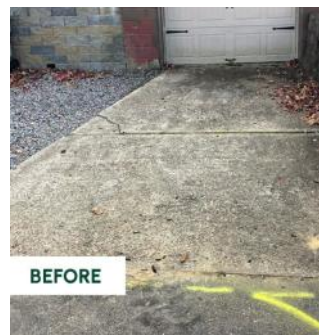

There were some variations between shows as the actors covered for microphones that weren't working, forgotten lines, and just about every other hiccup, without the audience ever knowing. On the first night, a microphone wasn't working and while it was getting fixed, Assistant Director Dr. Melissa Survinski mouthed to seventh-grader Mena O'Mara to improv as she was on-stage alone. "I started to freak out and thought about what my character would say," O'Mara improvised a monologue, without the audience ever catching on. "I was sooo happy when the other actors came on stage because then everything from there was familiar."

The plays ranged from murder mysteries and first dates to a hole in the wall and a cow jumping over the moon. When asked

how he selects the plays, Shumaker said, "I try to mix up our selections based on our talent and try to pick plays that will challenge our young actors as well."

One thing that is apparent at the curtain call is the camaraderie between the students. "The most fun part of doing Playfest is being able to meet and form close bonds with kids from other grades, and better friendships with people in my grade," said eighth-grader Morgan McAfee. 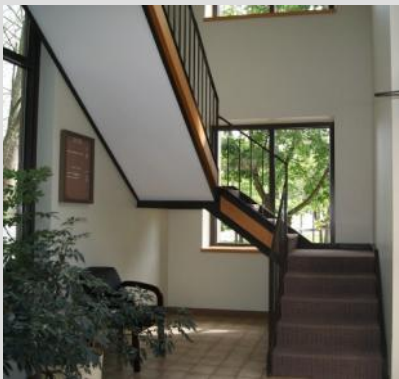

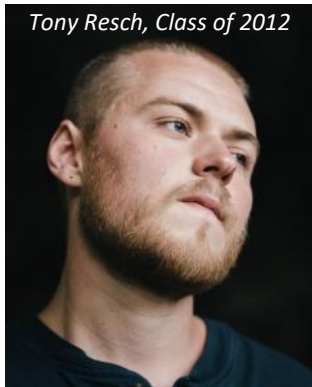
Tony Resch, Hampton High School Class of 2012, has always had a love of music. He has channeled that passion into a successful career in the music industry as a regional artist with a renewed focus on going national. In high school, Resch was part of Jam Band, a group of a few students that gathered after school to focus on singing and songwriting.

After graduation, Resch attended St. Johns University in Queens, NY. He familiarized himself with the music scene and played at events throughout the city at age 18. After a year, Resch transferred to the University of Pittsburgh to study and was part of the radio station WPTS. He hosted an underground music venue in his apartment on Bates Street for the next three years. Resch learned how to run a night-club and received good feedback from the community.

During that time, Resch

started *Royal Haunts*, layered tracks all done by himself. It's ambiguous if it is a band or a person. "It was truly the wild west of show production," explained Resch. He studied abroad in London, thanks to some savings bonds his aunt bought him as a kid, to study British pop/electronic music and had a residency in a jazz club before coming back to Pittsburgh, where he held shows around the singles and EP's he released.

In 2019, Resch and his friend Josh Orange created a rhythmic dance band called Pink Camo and then the pandemic hit. "It was a pretty bleak period," as there were no opportunities for live music. Tony and Josh worked together, studied music together, DJ'd together and even hosted live music festivals within the game Animal Crossing as one of their outlets. After the pandemic, Resch played at various venues around the city of Pittsburgh and established a residency at a club named Cobra.



Resch moved back to New York and performed in various clubs. He sang, played piano, DJ'd and oftentimes did lights and production. "I was very integrated into that world. I barely slept," explained Resch. To catch his breath and refocus, Resch recently moved back to Hampton. "It's a very complicated world, the music world. Steady trajectories like being a physician aren't available in music," He is touring, doing live events, and releasing new music. In his spare time, Resch enjoys writing as well as reading about global mythology and theology.

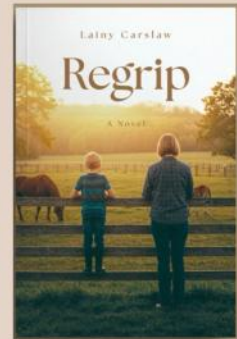
