Police Information

National Scholarship Finalists Named

Four Hampton High School seniors have been named finalists in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. HTSD is proud to recognize the following students for this achievement: Dakota Basista, Brennan Frank, Young Min Oh, and Danielle Sutterlin.

These students are among the approximately 15,000 finalists who are competing for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$30 million. In March, NMSC will begin notifying scholarship winners.

These finalists entered the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test their junior year, which served as an initial screen of program entrants. The nationwide pool of semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state.

To become a finalist, the semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application, in which they provide information about the semifinalist's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. A semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, write an essay, and earn SAT or ACT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test.

A Note from Township Council

ou may have noticed that a revision of the Township's Peddling and Soliciting Ordinance is once again on the agenda. In 2018, Council modified the existing ordinance to change the cut off time from 9:00 pm to 7:00 pm based on the belief that our residents would prefer not to be disturbed by door-to-door salespeople in the evening hours when they may be enjoying dinner, putting their children to bed, or simply relaxing. Unfortunately, the courts have determined that such an early cut off time is a violation of the free speech rights of the solicitors. As such, the Township will likely have to revise the ordinance again; this time to allow peddling and soliciting as late as 9:00 pm.

This is not a unique situation. More often than you might expect, the Township has to make concessions like this based on what the courts have decided. For example, did you know that the Township is not permitted to prohibit any type of business from operating within the boundaries of the Township? The Township can regulate where such businesses might be permitted to operate, based on zoning, but cannot ban them.

In this case, however, if you don't want door-to-door salespeople stopping at your house, there is something that you can do. The Township has a "no soliciting list" that any household or business can join. That list is provided to anyone who obtains a solicitor's permit in the Township, which is required for most people who are selling or seeking donations door-to-door. Any homes and businesses on the list should be skipped. You can




Wildcats Take Ice Hockey Championship
