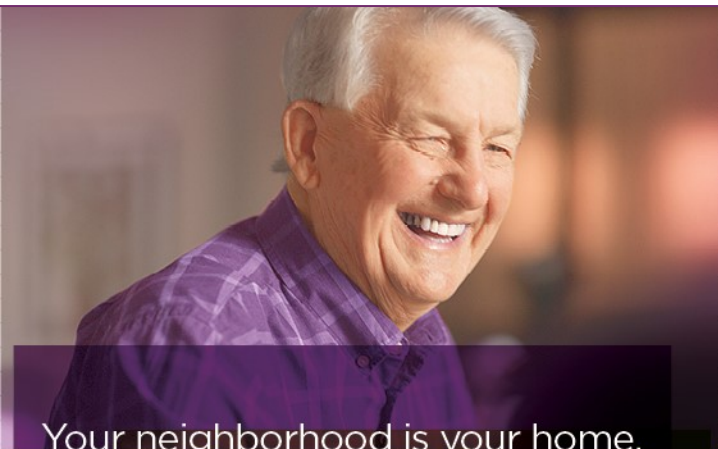
The grouper was estimated to weigh 300-500 pounds!

Police Log


The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 6/5/2020—7/8/2020:


DUI Arrest


 On June 7, 2020 at 7:35 p.m., Hampton Township Police (HTP) were dispatched to the area of Route 8 and Clearview Road after a witness called 911 to report a possible intoxicated driver. An officer was able to intercept the vehicle in question and observed that the car was unable to maintain its lane of travel. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle, and upon making contact with the vehicle operator, the officer immediately detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. The officer also observed other physical indicators of impairment while conversing with the driver. The operator submitted to field sobriety tests, which they failed to perform as had been instructed and demonstrated. The operator was also found to be in possession of drugs and was placed under arrest.


Vehicle Accident

 On June 9, 2020 at 3:51 p.m., HTP responded to Harts Run Road and Middle Road for a two-vehicle accident. Upon the officer's arrival, the vehicles were found to still be in the roadway with moderate damage. The accident occurred when one vehicle operator attempted to stop at the intersection but applied their clutch instead of brake, which resulted in the collision with a

vehicle within the intersection. Both vehicles were towed from the scene.

 On June 11, 2020 at 2:27 p.m., HTP responded to Route 8 at Duncan Avenue for a single vehicle rollover accident. Upon their arrival, they located a vehicle lying on its passenger side with moderate damage. The operator was found to be inside the vehicle, while multiple passengers were out of the car. All involved occupants sustained injuries from the crash and were transported by ambulance. The crash was said to have occurred when the operator struck the curb and a guiderail with the vehicle, which caused it to turn over. The vehicle was towed from the scene.

 On June 20, 2020 at 3:38 p.m., HTP were dispatched to the area of Route 8 and Wildwood Road for a report of a vehicle accident. Upon arrival, the officers located two heavily damaged vehicles blocking the right curb lane of Route 8. The accident occurred when the operator of one vehicle, which was traveling south on Route 8, went through a steady red signal, striking another vehicle traveling east on Wildwood Road. Both vehicles had to be towed from the scene.

 On June 23, 2020 at 10:43 p.m., HTP were dispatched to Topnick Drive for a single vehicle accident. Upon their arrival, officers located the vehicle in question resting against a guide rail. The operator stated that a deer ran in front of their vehicle, resulting in the vehicle sliding on the wet roadway and striking the guide rail. The vehicle had to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage.

Raccoon Baiting in Allegheny County

Over the past 19 years there has been a significant reduction in human and pet exposures to rabies throughout Allegheny County. This is largely due to the efforts of the rabies vaccination program for wild raccoons spearheaded by the Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

This year, employees and volunteers of the ACHD and USDA will be distributing vaccine-containing baits from July 31st through September 10th, 2020 across Allegheny County. During this time, please keep your dog on a leash, indoors, or confined to your property as much as possible during baiting and the week after. The risk of adverse effects to humans and animals due to exposure to the vaccine is minimal, but the ACHD and the township urge the public to avoid contact with the bait if possible.

"Hey, Hey! What'd You Say?"
Puts New Spin on Dealing with the Mean Kid

Hampton native Lisa Mack-Finn always knew she wanted to write a children's book. She had a way of putting together words to teach a lesson without it *feeling* like a lesson – an important technique when your target audience is children.

A former substitute teacher who currently works as the business coordinator for the Pine-Richland Youth Center, Ms. Mack-Finn understands how children think. She knows if you want children to listen, you must speak in a way that makes them feel valued and respected.

She had a great idea for a story, which sat in bits and pieces on her computer for a while. It was when she was strolling down the beach in Florida that she proclaimed she would finally finish and publish her book.

"Tom, my fiancé, had no idea it was even in the works," she said. "He loved the idea and from there I began the process of gathering all of those fragments, bits, and pieces to put together." Those bits and pieces formed the recently released "Hey, Hey! What'd You Say?" a thoughtful book about coping with the mean kid.



The book's characters – a bear, a family of bunnies, and a turtle with glasses – come together to try and figure out why the snake is so mean to everyone. They decide to treat the snake with kindness to get to the bottom of his behavior. It is a different approach than some kids may take with bullies or mean kids, but it is one Ms. Mack-Finn said should be explored more often.

Ms. Mack-Finn said she realizes that not all kids are going to be friends with each other. "But we should teach them to rule a few things out before just walking away. There is so much healing in words no matter the age."

"Hey, Hey! What'd You Say?" is not Ms. Mack-Finn's first book. She is the author of "Unknown," a memoir recounting her recovery from an accidental blow to the head that left her with a severe concussion. It was written to inspire anyone going through a tough time, especially those suffering from brain injuries. "They are life-changing," she said. "I like to be real in my writing, so you will really see who I am in that book. It's unedited because I wanted to leave it in the state in which my thoughts streamed."

For her next book, she plans to publish an unfinished fiction novel. "But I have had many ask me to continue writing for children," she said. "Honestly, I kind of go where the wind takes me and something really needs to strike me creatively to present it for everyone to see." "Hey, Hey! What'd You Say?" is now available on Amazon.

Applications are available at the Hampton Township Police Department at 3101 McCully Road. Please complete and return the application no later than September 4, 2020 to be considered for the academy. To be eligible for the HCPA, you must be at least 18 years of age, never been convicted of a felony in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or elsewhere, and reside in Hampton Township or a neighboring community.

Topics include: Police Academy Training, narcotics investigations and opioids, evidence collections, traffic law and enforcement, patrol and criminal procedure use of force/special response team, court system, forensics, use of force simulator, traffic accident investigations/DUI, community relations, domestic violence, and role play scenarios. The students will also have an opportunity to participate in a ride-along program with police officers during a shift, upon completion of the academy.

Noteworthy incidents and events:

- NHVFD responded to the report of a vehicle rollover with entrapment in the 4000 block of Route 8. Crews arrived to find a single vehicle accident with the driver still entrapped in the vehicle. Crews worked to extricate the victim and assisted with cleanup of the scene.
- NHVFD assisted in a large area search detail for a missing person. Crews spent several hours searching neighborhoods and wooded areas in an attempt to locate the missing person. Thankfully, the person was located safely at a nearby hospital.
- NHVFD responded to a residential structure fire in the 2300 block of Linden Avenue. Initial crews were able to quickly stop the spread of the fire and NHVFD assisted with salvage and overhaul.
- NHVFD responded to the report of a vehicle rollover with entrapment on the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Crews arrived to find a single-vehicle accident and assisted EMS in securing a landing zone for a medical helicopter.

With nearly 50 staff members composed of full-time, part-time, and volunteer EMT's, AEMT's and Paramedics, we pledge that our 2 stations in Shaler and Hampton are staffed and ready to respond at a moment's notice.

All of us share a passion for EMS and the varied challenges it brings every day. Many of our staff live in the communities that we serve as lifelong residents or more recent additions. Two great examples are our Operational Supervisors, Dave and Cindy, who moved into the community 17 & 18 years ago, respectively, to work here, and one of our senior staff, Ray Dietz, who started volunteering at 16 and has now been an employee for 18 years, which – not coincidentally – is how long his dad, George, has volunteered here!

On any given day, we respond to critical illnesses or injuries. Our well-trained clinical staff are prepared to help save a life. While the next call may be for something much less dire, all of our calls require the utmost compassion and empathy, even when maybe the most crucial equipment needed is a pillow, a warm blanket, and a hand to hold. As the Chief, I strive every

day to ensure that we're ready for whatever the day may bring.

While we are fortunate to have an amazing staff, the reality is that we cannot do it alone. The communities of Etna, Hampton, and Shaler support us in amazing ways every day. Their police officers respond on our calls and always have our backs. The fire departments – all 9 of them 100% volunteer – work side-by-side with us on many calls to ensure public safety. And “behind the scenes” is our 12-member board of directors, all volunteering their time to support the quality and long-term vision of our organization. Each board member is already busy with their personal and professional lives; however, they serve, and many of them also serve as your local elected officials! Lastly, all the other local municipal leaders, whether elected or employed, who support our organization in more ways than you can imagine, we recognize you. All acknowledged here understand the importance of strong and progressive community-based EMS.

The last piece of the puzzle is YOU! Our annual subscription drive is a large portion of our funding stream – and it's one that can benefit you directly by decreasing your out-of-pocket expenses by as much as 50% if you need emergency ambulance service. Will you support us?

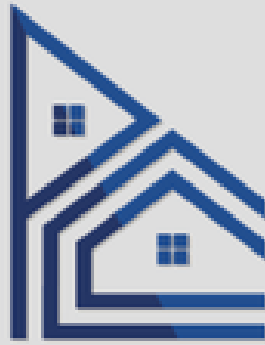

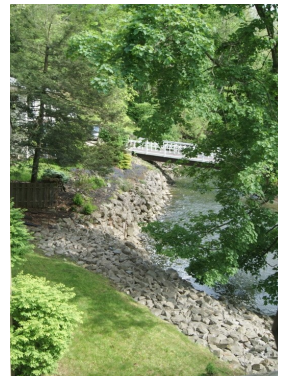

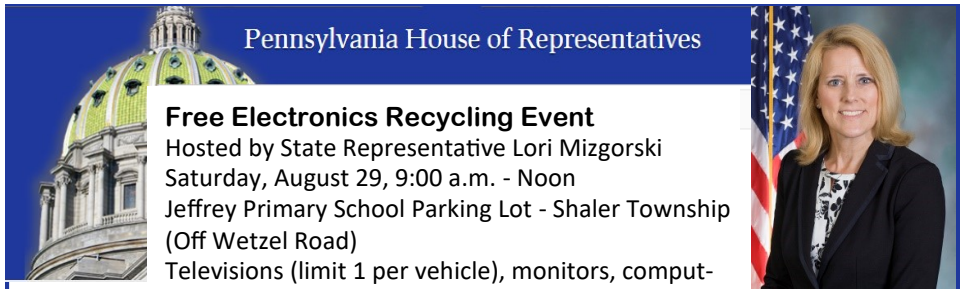
