Hampton Deer Management Program Opens Up to Private Properties Over 5 Acres

Since the early 2000's, Hampton Township has implemented an archery deer management program on Township owned property. As development expands, the deer's natural habitat is diminishing. This overpopulation has led to a rise in auto accidents, the potential for Lyme disease cases, and property damage. To promote community safety and well-being, the Township is now offering homeowners the chance to have an approved archer come onto their property and help manage the deer population. 

PennDOT District 11 has announced roadway improvement work on Mt. Royal Boulevard (Route 4019) in Hampton and Shaler Townships, weather permitting.

Single-lane alternating traffic restrictions with flaggers will occur on Mt. Royal Boulevard between Route 8 and Grant Avenue weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. through late October. Crews from A. Liberoni, Inc. will conduct drainage improvement work to begin the project.



Improvement work on this \$11.89 million group paving job includes milling and paving, base repair, drainage improvements, and other various construction related activities. Additional details will be provid-

ed in advance of paving operations.

Motorists can check conditions on more than 40,000 roadway miles, including color-coded winter conditions on 2,900 miles, by visiting www.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information, and access to more than 1,000 traffic cameras.

511PA is also available through a smartphone application for

iPhone and Android devices, by calling 5-1-1, or by following regional Xalerts accessible on the 511PA website.

Working America Conducting Door-to-Door Organizing Drive

The Police Department would like to inform the residents of Hampton that Working America will be conducting a door-to-door organizing drive, through at least November 6th, 2024.

Working America's canvassers may at times display picture identification cards and wear red safety vests that display their affiliation with Working America. The purpose of their organizing drive is to educate working people about issues that affect them and sign up new members. Working America does not sell any kind of products.

Their canvassing typically operates in the late afternoon and evening, from 3:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Courts have recognized the right of canvassers to canvass during these hours, notwithstanding any local or state curfews.

Because Working America is engaged in constitutionally protected political speech in its canvassing operation, it is not required to obtain a permit prior to engaging in this activity.

Their right to engage in this activity is protected under the law.



(April and September), Guatemala (August) and Vietnam (October).

Strong Hampton ties lie within the organization. Administrative Assistant Gretchen Homison, a Hampton resident and graduate, has worked for the organization for five years. Previously a preschool teacher, Gretchen strongly believes in the importance of the Surgicorps mission to change lives in the developing world. "I am so grateful to be part of Surgicorps," stated Gretchen. "Our volunteers have changed countless lives, not just by the work they do, but by inspiring so many others."

Another Hampton resident, Dr. Cathy Boyle, will help direct the recovery room on an upcoming trip to Guatemala. "I am so blessed to play a small part of this amazing team that changes peoples lives," said Cathy.

Linda Esposto, Retired Executive Director of Surgicorps, has led the organization for 20 years. DeNese Olson began in 2014 and is the Director of Operations and Outreach. Surgicorps has outstanding volunteers throughout the country who both travel on trips, paying 100% of their expenses, and support the office in many ways. Volunteers help Surgicorps pack all medical supplies for each trip with few exceptions. Surgicorps is a self-sustaining operation who strives to not deplete the supplies of developing countries. Surgicorps then donates the surplus supplies to the hospitals.

The individuals receiving treatment in countries such as Zambia, Guatemala, and Vietnam lack access to the most basic of health care, including treatments such as reconstructive sur-

gery for cleft lips and palates, severe

burn deformities, and a number of congenital defects. In many of these countries, patients must travel by foot for hours - sometimes days - to get medical attention.

Surgicorps makes long term commitments to each country and has recently begun providing educational workshops in Zambia. The organization hopes to expand these programs

into other countries in the future. These workshops teach both burn prevention and burn care, as many people in developing countries are severely burned from cooking on open fires. In Vietnam, burns also occur as a result of acid attacks. These deformities impact the patient's education, peer relationships and are a financial burden to a family. Some countries have no plastic surgeons while others have a limited number, which reduces the patient's options for medical care.

Jack Demos feels that, "We do this because we can, we do this because we want to, and we do this because we should," and that everyone can make a difference. People can support Surgicorps by making a monetary donation or purchasing non-medical gifts for patients (go to





A Budget to Benefit Our Community

I was proud to add my yes vote to Pennsylvania's 2024-25 fiscal year budget after a couple of busy weeks in Harrisburg. Our state's financial plan, now officially signed into law by Gov. Josh Shapiro, addresses several key areas that align with my priorities as a state representative.

The budget invests \$1.3 billion in public schools statewide, and these dollars make a positive difference for communities in Allegheny County and in the North Hills. The Hampton Township School District, specifically, will receive \$393,462 in additional


funds per the budget. These monies are important for providing students, teachers, and support staff alike with the tools needed to succeed at the highest possible level.

Also contained in the budget is a \$26 million increase in subsidized child-care services. Working families need all the support necessary to maintain a healthy balance between financial stability and the well-being of loved ones.

Health preservation measures and health facilities are significant budget beneficiaries as well. Efforts to promote health and disease prevention saw a \$2.7 million increase (over 115%) when compared to last year's budget, and state health centers received \$3.1 million additional dollars for this fiscal year. Being a state legislator and practicing emergency physician, I'm privileged to also represent my medical colleagues across the Commonwealth and work to keep all Pennsylvanians healthy and safe.

Compromise Harrisburg Budget Achieves Mixed Results

Pennsylvania's annual budget process came to an end at the halfway point of July as lawmakers in Harrisburg were finally able to decide upon a budget for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The budget is the most complex aspect of our work in Harrisburg and an opportunity for the General Assembly to do right by the people of Pennsylvania. The final product produced a budget at \$47.6 billion, an increase of \$2.7 billion, or 6%, over the prior fiscal year.

At this rate, the budget spends \$3.3 billion more than the anticipated revenues within the fiscal year, adding to the structural deficit the Commonwealth is already facing. The unsustainable structure of the budget could lead to increased taxes over time, which will create additional strain on our families and small businesses.

No state budget is perfect, and there are certainly aspects of the 2024-25 budget process worthy of celebrating. This budgetary cycle led to significant opportunities for young people in Pennsylvania, including a scholarship grant program and performance-based budg-

eting for Pennsylvania's state-funded institutions of higher education. This mandates more transparency and accountability from these institutions to ensure we are providing the strongest educational value for our students.

Investment into our young people starts at an early age, which led to record spending increases into K through 12 schools, and will primarily benefit students of lower income school districts, but will grow opportunities for all students.

Another positive outcome of the budget cycle was significant changes to Pennsylvania's tax codes. The budget maintained the current phase-down schedule of the Corporate Net Income Tax, from 8.49% to 7.99% in 2025. Improvement was also made to the Commonwealth's Net Operating Loss deductions, which starts in January 2025 and gradually increases to 80% by 2029.

As the budget process is now behind us, I am hopeful the legislature can build upon the compromises of the budget process and gear our focuses toward continuing strong, bipartisan efforts in Harrisburg. We must restore civility and respect in our Commonwealth, and I hope our Legislature can be the example in achieving this goal.
